



<u>2022 – 2023 INTERACT CLUB PROJECT GRANTS</u>

INTRODUCTION

The Rotary District 5000 Youth Service Committee is excited to offer a grant program, designed to provide much-needed resources and funds to noteworthy, unique, impactful, and collaborative projects designed and executed by youth within the State of Hawaii. D5000 partners with nearly 30 Interact Clubs throughout the islands to perform community service projects within their local communities. Each club has limited resources and funds to take on larger projects that may involve others within their communities and networks. The funds will be used to support such projects on each island, selected by the D5000 Youth Service Committee based upon four (4) criteria:

- 1. Community Impact (how did the project address a community concern)
- 2. Organization and execution of the project (how well was the project executed)
- 3. Expand reach to increase awareness of Rotary (how was Rotary promoted)
- 4. Engagement of participants (how well did the participants work together)

Through these projects, our youth and particularly our Interact Clubs, will learn leadership skills, partner with their Rotary and Rotaract Clubs, and make an impact in their community to further the mission and image of Rotary.

Grant Amount: \$500 (1 grant available per County / 2 for Oahu)

One grant maximum per Interact Club

Interact Clubs may partner but there must be a "lead" club.
