ASTRA Clubs are eligible for Altrusa International Foundation Grants for their community service projects!

- The Project Grant Applications must be emailed by the due date to foundation@altrusa.org.
- Do not mail applications to the Chicago office. A confirmation email will be sent to you when the application is received. Questions about grant applications may be directed to Dr. Kantrice Rose, Foundation Executive Director. You will receive an email confirmation, to the member listed on your application, upon receipt at the International Foundation office.

 - Cycle 2: Applications due March 15
- In addition, Altrusa and ASTRA Clubs chartering now may receive a one-time grant up to \$2,000 to begin service in their communities. The application must be received within one year of the charter date.
- The Altrusa International Foundation, Inc. reserves the right to make the final decision on all applications. The grant recipient is obligated to use the grant award for the intended purpose and must file a report within one year after the grant is awarded.
- Altrusa Clubs, **ASTRA Clubs**, and Districts may apply for one service grant per cycle in the fiscal year, and all applicants must agree to the terms of the grant. If an application is not awarded Foundation funds, the Club or District may reapply in the next cycle.

COLLEGE/UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIPS

There is a relatively new ASTRA College/University Scholarship, funded by the Altrusa International Foundation, designed to recognize up to four college and university ASTRA members who are actively participating in an ASTRA club, have exemplified a genuine concern for the welfare of others in their community, and have grown through service in ASTRA.

Scholarships will be awarded to ASTRA members whose outstanding service to their community through their ASTRA and sponsoring Altrusa Clubs has helped them grow in Ability, Service, Training, Responsibility, and Achievement.

Applicants must be an active ASTRA member and must be enrolled in and currently attending an institution of higher learning (college, university, technical school, etc.) as of the *March 15th deadline* for application.

SERVICE

The ASTRA Club Service Award has been established by Altrusa International and sponsored by Altrusa International Foundation to encourage ASTRA Clubs to actively participate in service projects designed to meet specific needs in the local community or within their own school community. This award is an opportunity for Altrusa International to recognize outstanding ASTRA Clubs for their achievements in service through District and International Competition.

Service projects nominated for the ASTRA Service Award are judged each year prior to the District Conferences. First-place winners from each District are entered in the competition at the International Level. Established judging criteria are used by Districts and by International. Projects will be assessed by impartial judges based on their merits and results. One (1) service project from Clubs-At-Large may be included in the competition at the International level. This service project selection will be organized and overseen by the International ASTRA Committee.

Procedures for Submitting Entries • ASTRA Clubs submit entries for the District District ASTRA competition to their Chairperson, or the person appointed by the Governor, by the ditrict's deadline or no later than MARCH 1st (for all districts). Entries must be submitted in PDF format unless specified otherwise by the District. Entries received late or that do not comply with guidelines will not be considered.

History of ASTRA:

In an effort to increase opportunities for young people to positively impact their communities, Altrusa International, Inc. appointed a special Youth Group Committee in July 1965 to identify and develop a suggested structure and name for youth groups sponsored by Altrusa Clubs.

Recognizing the community service potential in sponsoring these youth groups, they decided that these new "ASTRA Clubs" would be based on the following principles, as adopted by the Altrusa International Board of Directors:

- Altrusa's participation in the area of youth groups should not duplicate what is already being done by other organizations.
- Altrusa's participation should be unique in purpose. ASTRA has grown every decade and now has ASTRA Clubs located in communities all around the United States, Puerto Rico, New Zealand and India.

The ASTRA Club of Atlee HS, Mechanicsville, VA went to the Hanover Adult Center with members of the Altrusa Club of Richmond VA. We helped the staff clean and sanitize the facility. We organize drawers, clean the refrigerators and cabinets to discard items that are "out of date". We also help with decorating and cleaning wheelchairs, tables and chairs.

The Center has been providing services to meet a wide variety of needs for differently abled individuals and their care partners in the Greater Richmond, VA Metro area for over 43 years. One of our former ASTRA students actually works at the facility with her mom leading the facility. It is always nice to visit with them and help out these individuals and their families.



The ASTRA Club of Atlee HS, Mechanicsville, VA prepares Valentine Goodie Bags for the children of families applying to Housing Families First. This helps with keeping the children busy while the adults applying at the home fill out applications and talk with the staff. We put juice boxes, snacks, crayons, coloring books and a small toy in each bag – along with some stickers and an activity book. The bags are always done at Valentines Day so the ASTRA students can decorate the bags.

This facility gives families facing homelessness the opportunity to build a legacy for their families by providing a path to a permanent home. Their vision is a Richmond region where all children and their families have a safe place to call home.
