We need everyone's participation to make our fundraiser a success and hit our budget of \$9,500. Our activity at this month's meeting is to write notes to our past NTGD donors thanking them for their support and planting the seed to support us again. We'll provide a list with names/addresses for members to use. If you have NEW donors in mind, this will be a great opportunity to write a short note to them as well.

Don't forget about other methods we use for fundraising: Amazon Smile and grocery stores. We all shop, some more than others, so why not make every buck count? Enroll your account(s) in the platform's charity program, community rewards, etc. Every little bit helps and those dollars will add up quickly, especially around peak shopping times.

Our Little Libraries have arrived and our work day on Aug 20th will be the assembly of the boxes. We'll need several teams to assemble each box, which takes about 45 minutes each. The boxes will still need to be installed at their appropriate locations and filled with books. But we're well on our way to completion.

Community Service Chairs, Rita and Rhonda, along with Wendy and myself, toured the 9th Street Boxing Gym and met with staff there to learn how we can serve their students. We're collecting school supplies, snacks and drinks (like Gatorade or water) for our monthly service donation. Kids use laptops and tablets most of the time so don't need as much paper/pencil/folder type supplies. But they still use those tools sometimes. So, focus on computer printer paper (which will be used by the gym's tutor), single subject spirals, pens and pencils. Snacks should be nutritious – granola bars, protein bars, beef sticks, nuts, etc., and drinks are water or power drinks with electrolytes.

And, our most exciting news for August will be welcoming another new member to Altrusa Garland: Maria Contreras. Please be ready to welcome her into this great organization, help her plug in and share her talents with us. It's an exciting time to be an Altrusan.

Altrusa Garland - Service By the Numbers

There's an old country song that says, "The stars may lie, but the numbers never do..." This is not only true, but impressive when it comes to our club's community impact numbers! Thanks to Sharon Tramonte, District Nine now offers a great new one-pager that shows our impact in the community. Our 2021-22 report includes the amounts of scholarship dollars, books donated, and volunteer hours!

One new-to-us number is the Fiscal Impact. Using a metric determined by the Independent Sector and the Do Good Institute, the 2021 value of one volunteer hour in Texas is \$28.14. So, doing the math with our 8200 volunteer hours in 2021-22, our fiscal impact to Garland (and surrounding cities) is a whopping \$230,748! Wow!

There are an additional 3000 books in Stephanie Noland's garage, with 2050 of those ready for an event. There are 12 boxes that partially prepared, ie. sorted, but not stamped, etc.

The Community Service Committee and Programs Committee met via Zoom on Friday, July 29 to coordinate monthly programs with donations collected at the monthly meeting.

The next social will be in September. If you have any suggestions, please contact Janet Black or Tammy Caruso.


Grant Update
