SERVICING GARLAND BOOK DESERTS WITH LITTLE FREE LIBRARIES

The Garland Altrusa Club received a \$4000 grant from Altrusa International Foundation, Inc., which will reach 1530 students at 6 schools – Caldwell, Centerville, Montclair, Southgate, Weaver and Williams – and at Gale Fields Recreation Center in Embree Park. Club members will interface with schools' librarians, the recreation center director and local Boy Scout troops to build, paint, install and fill 7 Little Free Libraries. Club members will also host reading events to celebrate each library openings. The objectives include providing easily accessible books 24/7, developing a reading culture and improving reading proficiency scores.

Many schools in Garland lie in book deserts, a geographic area where reading materials are difficult to obtain. The librarian at Weaver Elementary, Laura Thomas, said, "Our families live in a book desert as they do not have a print-rich environment due to lack of access to books at home, in the classroom or limited access to school or public libraries." She adds that a fear of fines, transportation issues, limited hours and fear of government-issued cards prevent many families in her school's neighborhood from using the city libraries.

The location of each Little Free Library was strategically chosen based on demographics. At least 80% of each school is classified low-income with the same percentage receiving free lunches and breakfasts and score either C or D on the Texas standardized test with 29 to 38% of the students proficient in reading.
