




DAYS FOR GIRLS

Children of Zambia

The 2021—2022 President's Project is to support the efforts of Family Legacy's Tree of Life Program. This is a transitional full-time living facility for children who have faced situations no child should have to experience. Children admitted into the Tree of Life may suffer from extreme medical conditions or an unsuitable home situation. Spanning over 130-acres, the facility currently has a neighborhood of 64 homes, a school, access to quality healthcare, playgrounds, a working farm and more. Each of the homes has about a dozen children.

Throughout the year, members will be collecting, washing, and sorting clothes and shoes to ship to the facility. School supplies and books will also be collected and shipped.



FROM YOUR BOARD

Born of Tragedy...World War I ... and now COVID-19, Altrusa was founded under the extreme need for women to unite to serve. This past year with the COVID-19 pandemic affecting our world, we again have an extreme need for women and men to unite to serve.


When Archduke Franz Ferdinand was assassinated in 1914, events were set in motion that would call on women to serve in ways they never had before. World War I found a record number of women called to do men's jobs. In 1917 Alfred Durham, a Kiwanian, saw the need for a civic organization for women and began to set up just that. Altrusa Institute was started in Nashville, Louisville, and Dayton Ohio. Upon moving along to Indianapolis, he joined up with Mamie L. Bass who had a much greater vision for Altrusa. She took the reigns and began to build Altrusa into the wonderful collection of selfless women that it is today.

It is hard for me to imagine the stresses that women were under. Their men away at war, most had never worked outside the home before, certainly not in the way that global wartime demanded, yet times called for dangerous duty in munition factories, airplane factories, and communications, while also keeping farms and families functioning to support our troops. Still, at this time, women were looking to serve their communities through Altrusa.

I wonder if we have become too focused on how the pandemic affects us personally that we are perhaps less active in serving the less fortunate of our world. Covid is a tragedy, but perhaps not as great as WWI. Let's try to up our game. We have wonderful, caring, selfless members. Now it is time to increase our numbers and get into high gear to again unite for service to our world and our communities.

United Nations: New Focus, Name Change

Many Altrusans have asked why the United Nations changed the title of our NGO unit (nongovernmental organization/no voting status) from under the longtime Department of Public Information (DPI) to the brand new Department of Global Communications (DGC)/Civil Society Unit. WOW! So many words-hard to remember!

Simply, the new name DGC reflects the current ways of working-underscoring the interactivity and cooperation in information managementbetween the United Nations and its stakeholders like Altrusa International. The key word is "interactivity". The old term" public Information" was deemed passive while "communication" relates to a relationship of mutual interchange.

Then, due to the expansion of activities of our unit, NGO relations- which is under the Dept. of Global Communication- changed its name to become "Civil Society Unit". The new term reflects the UN's belief that we ALL are part of an international civil society. The UN hopes this belief of a world civil society will be incorporated in all areas of its activities.

The United Nations extends a "thank you" for NGO's commitment-like Altrusa Internationaland our dynamic work. The UN-when the public return date is issued- and Altrusa members look forward to our continuous engagement with serving our worldwide communities.

TECH CORNER

Dying to learn the latest technology buzzwords but don't know where to start? We have you covered! Lets start with some basics.

When cruising the internet, here are some handy words to know.


- (Web) Address—Often referred to as just the "address". This is just like it sounds. It is the location of the website you are looking for. It is also know as the URL (Uniform Resource Locator).
- Address box—this is the long rectangular box that is at the top of your browser window.
 Just type in your favorite website into the address box, hit enter, and you are on your way!
- Browser—short for web browser A browser is software that is used to access the internet.
 A browser lets you visit websites. The most common browser software titles on the market are: Microsoft Internet
 Explorer, Google's Chrome, Mozilla
 Firefox, and Apple's Safari. Browser availability depends which computer or phone you use.

And while you are cruising the internet, are you interested in knowing what kind of site you are

TECHNO-TERMS "THE BASICS"

looking at? Is it a government website, a nonprofit or maybe a commercial website. The extension will let you know a lot of the times. The "extension" is the last three letters after the last "dot" or period. Here are some of the most common extensions.

- .com—typically denotes a business or commercial website
- .org—denotes a non-profit organization
- .edu—denotes an educational institution like a college or university
- .gov—denotes a government site
- .mil—denotes a military site
- .net—this is just another form of commercial ".com" website



Here are a few more helpful things to know

Click—this generally refers to clicking (press and release) the LEFT mouse button. The left side of the mouse always assumes that the user is right handed!

Right clicking—this will display a shortcut menu that is specific to the item that you have clicked. Point at something, right click and see what you get!
