Boy did you guys "up your game" this year!!! Last year you collected a total of 5,637 Christmas Cards for Veterans. This year you collected 9,748 cards. Not only were 12 Interact Clubs involved but also three Rotary Clubs and one business. The cards made their way to the several VA Medical Centers in Southwestern Pennsylvania, courtesy of VFW Post No. 33 in Greensburg. Here is the breakdown of where the cards came from:

I haven't heard any comments against our 2018-2019 proposed District 7330 Interact Project so we will be collecting food items for local emergency food pantries. These are the pantries that you find in your community, in churches, Salvation Army or possibly at thrift stores.

Unlike the county food banks, these pantries are used by individuals that are facing a food emergency, individuals who have nothing to eat and people who could even be homeless. While most people think that pasta and spaghetti sauce are good items, what about the people who only have a hot plate to prepare food? That is why some pantries would prefer canned chicken or canned tuna, cereal and energy bars.

What you collect depends on what your emergency food pantries need the most. A good starting point is to canvass your community and identify these pantries and then contact them to see what they need. You may even find that paper products are needed.

As an Interact Club you have great ideas on how to tackle a project and thus you should be able to figure this one out easily. You can do a homeroom challenge at your school, you could hold an event of some sort and instead of charging admission you can ask for nonperishable food items, you could challenge your spon-

soring Rotary Club to help collect items, you could challenge other clubs or organizations in your school to also collect items, just to mention a few.

All that we need you to do is to keep track of how many items you collect and then contribute to your local emergency food pantries. By doing this, we will be able to come up with a number for how many individual items were contributed by the Interact Clubs in District 7330 and we can announce that figure at the Youth Luncheon at the District Conference on May 4.

You can start on this District-wide Project at anytime but we will need to have it wrapped up by April 30, 2019.
