District 7305 Interact Symposium will be held on Saturday, October 19 in Derry Area High School.







This month, the Ligonier Interact Club had been busy organizing and preparing for the Lip Sync Battle. However, the time and effort put into this event was well worth it! With the help of Latrobe Interact Club, we were able to get more participation and raise more money than ever before. In total, we were able to raise \$2,135! Half of this money was donated to the New Florence Police Dept. K9 Unit to train the police dog Gunnar. The other \$1,067.50 went to the Latrobe Backpack Program. We would again like to thank Latrobe for all of their hard work and assistance in making this event possible! Also in February, several members volunteered their time to assisting at the American Red Cross Blood Drive that was held at Laurel Valley Elementary School.





Last October we talked about the upcoming merger of Rotary Districts 7300 and 7330 to form Rotary District 7305. Well the merger will become effective on July 1, 2019. Each District has a Transition Team and each Transi-



tion Team has sub-committees which have been charged to ensure that the transition from two Districts into one is done as smoothly as possible.
