President's Report – January 13, 2026

Greetings to you all and Happy New Year.

As we begin the year, I would like to thank you all for your contributions thus far. We are now into the second half of our term for 2025-2026. We must keep the momentum moving with the introduction of the new board and related tasks.

- During the last month: I have made one club visit with the Calgary Club to induct 8 new members. It was a success as they doubled the club's size. I have also heard that they signed up another new member. This is awesome. We need to promote this to other clubs as there is always hope with a little effort.
- I reviewed the CI Board Policies and provided some feedback to Vice-President Art Brassard.
- I attend virtually two Finance committee meetings to review our standings with respect to finances, procedures and banking. Will need motion to move UBS investments to US Bank.
- I attended virtually a 2026 Convention committee mtg – Given the situation on Minneapolis, Headquarters has been receiving concerns about the location of the convention. We must prepare for lower attendance.
- I have been communicating via email to other board positions to follow up on activities in progress.
- I contacted Past President Phil Hanson regarding the status of CI's tax-exempt status. We are just waiting for one acknowledgement from the IRS to indicate all clubs have retroactively been reinstated. Our tax return is ready to go but due to filing for an extension Phil is attempting to wait for the letter prior to filing the return. Members will be updated shortly.
- I followed up with Winter Board meeting attendees.
- I completed an NGO Form and submitted it to US Bank.



My “Why I’m In” — and Why Asking Matters: Cheryl MacKenzie

I officially joined the Edmonton Cosmopolitan Club in January 2018, but my connection to Cosmopolitan began years earlier. In 2012, I started volunteering with Rock’n August in St. Albert, working alongside members from both the St. Albert and Edmonton Cosmopolitan Clubs to help raise funds for diabetes research. As someone newly diagnosed with Type 2 diabetes, this cause was deeply personal and meaningful to me.



For many years, I worked shoulder to shoulder with Cosmo members through Rock’n August. Interestingly, no one ever spoke to me about CI or invited me to attend a meeting. This wasn’t intentional or anyone’s fault — we were focused on the work at hand, and joining simply wasn’t top of mind. This experience, as I’ve since learned, is not uncommon.

In January 2018, I was finally asked to join — and I said yes.

Since then, I’ve had the privilege of serving at the Federation and International levels. My “why” is not unique: I’m a Cosmo because I want to make a difference in my community and support diabetes research. I chose to take on greater roles because I wanted to increase my impact.

There’s an important lesson in my story. We need to remember to *ask* the people around us to join our organization. Asking can feel uncomfortable, but it’s essential. When we don’t ask, we may avoid hearing “no,” but we also remove the opportunity for someone to say “yes.” My “why” is to help grow this organization by simply asking the question — and I encourage each of you to do the same.
