

Report of the VP of Finance

It is with mixed emotions I publish my final report as your Vice President of Finance in Cosmo Topics. Let me start by sending you warm thoughts and best wishes and may you enjoy peace, joy and happiness now and into the future!



After five years it is time for me to move along anyway as we know it is hard to polish an old boot! Thank you to the executive board, it was a challenging year and we pulled together to get things accomplished as we had outlined at the International Convention

in Sioux City, IA. to the best of our ability and time commitments. We always were open to new suggestions and had you, our members, in mind during all our deliberations. Some of the board's set goals are still in progress but we are doing our due diligence to accomplish them.

I have had a few unexpected items come up with financial records and reports but the International Board is addressing these items and is continuing to move forward. We have drafted the 2023-2024 annual budget with the assistance of the executive director and this will be presented to the membership for approval at the convention in Norfolk.

At the beginning of this year, we estimated our income and expenditures and prepared our annual budget, and the board has been diligent in watching our expenditures and bringing in income. I am pleased to report that we should show another modest surplus by year-end. The surplus is derived from lower costs incurred on executive director salary and benefits and travel by the executive board. These savings are offset by lower dues revenues, expenditures on executive director search, and higher costs for mailing and printing issues of Cosmo Topics. Also, we offered and encouraged Clubs to sign up on ClubRunner and International will pay the set-up fee and first year lite subscription cost. The driver behind our finances depends on dues charged to you our members, and we thank everyone for continuing to send in dues on a timely basis.

Wow, it is hard to believe the Cosmo year is almost over and we have all been very busy this year getting new members, marketing Cosmopolitan, raising funds for helping to find a cure, sending kids to camp and learning all we can with great programming.

We held our Federation meeting in Sioux Falls May 5 and 6 and had a great attendance and wonderful fellowship. The meeting started Friday late afternoon and evening with a hospitality event. Attendees could take part in a downtown sculpture walk, shopping, visit the Washington Pavilion or just socialize. A good time was had by all. Saturday began with all committees meeting followed by the starting of the Federation business meeting. Our International guests were President-elect Dick Gorton and Candy Gorton from Omaha who brought news of International and goals for the upcoming 2023-2024 year. It was so great to have them in attendance. Our Saturday noon speaker was Richard Crawford. Richard is an inspirational, humorous and motivational speaker. He was legally blind from Retinitis Pigmentosa by the age of 10. Richard overcame many obstacles in his school years but became the first person in his family to attend college graduating with majors in Business Administration and Business Education from Wartburg College in Waverly, IA. He later received his MBA from the University of South Dakota in Vermillion, SD. Richard and his wife Sara met on a blind date. They have been married since 1982 and have three children and two granddaughters which he enjoys spending time with.

Today, Richard is retired after 40 years as a Financial Advisor. He has had clients in 27 states and 5 countries. At retirement, he was working with fourth and fifth generations of family members and has received numerous awards as a top producer.

Richard values education and prides himself on his community service and spoke about all the obstacles being blind living in a world that is black to him, about his life being blind, getting asked to leave the school for the blind because he was a discipline problem and then the obstacles when he went to attending public school being blind. But, his message was the inspiration he shared to everyone that if you believe in yourself you can do it. All obstacles can be overcome and he was a delight to listen to. A great inspiration and motivation for all in attendance.

Our business meeting continued in the afternoon followed by the Awards banquet and installation of the new Federation officers. A wonderful weekend for all attending the Federation convention.

The Rapid City Club has a net increase of 6 new members this year. They do fund raising by ushering at Hockey Games, Concerts and indoor Football Games which profits total between \$20,000 and \$22,000 annually. They also work Summer Nights in downtown Rapid City every week and at the Sports Expo in February with the Shrine club. Their profit this year was \$27,000. They will be donating approximately \$50,000 to charitable organizations.

They meet weekly for their meetings and are out in the public interacting with people and groups and promoting Cosmopolitan.

The Sioux Falls Club continues to work on their marketing plan. They worked, as one of their fund raising events, the 4 day Sportsman Show in March. Their largest event is the Sweetest Day of Golf which will be held on September 11 and generates \$30,000 which goes to sponsor kids for camp. They also will be working the local Fair in August. The club also does community projects such as packing lunches for Lunch is Served, helped with a fun run for Thrive for kids and they are a sponsor of the Veterans Community Project tiny homes which are being built and will do volunteer work for that project. They hold their meetings on the first and third Monday of each month at noon with great programs. Again, Sioux Falls is very active in the community and out promoting Cosmopolitan.

Newsletters are sent out every month to the membership to keep them informed of activities and sharing of ideas, including news from International. Visits have been made by Governor to the clubs and the North Central Federation is a very active.





Mo-Kan Federation, By Dayton Shepherd, Governor




COSMO MEMBER STATS 2022-2023


Membership by Federations










