

## FOUNDATION UPDATE

Ed Thompson, Chairman Cosmopolitan Diabetes Foundation



I regret to report that the Foundation had a \$19,000 loss for the year, but it is important to note that none of that loss came from any contributions that had been donated to the Foundation. We had enough in our equity reserves to cover the loss. In response to this loss, the board passed a resolution to maintain a balance in the equity account of at least two years' expenses before making any grants from equity.

Also at the board meeting, we elected the following officers: Ed Thompson, Chairman; Richard Harrison, Vice Chairman; and Jerry Sigmund, Secretary. Tom Stone retired from the Board after serving two consecutive terms; three years of which he served as chairman. The Capital Federation has elected Bob Winters to replace Tom on the board and Del Oberst was re-elected by the Mid States Federation to serve a second term.

Although contributions to the Discovery Fund, as well as our investment income has been down for the last several years, the board was pleased to award the following grants: \$3,000 to C.I. Diabetes and Endocrinology Center in Columbia, MO; \$3,000 to Crusader Clinic in Rockford, IL; \$2,000 to Camp Cosmopolitan in Scottsbluff, NE; \$2,000 to the Cornbelt Diabetes Connection in Omaha, NE; \$1,400 to Health Care Access in Lawrence, KS; and \$250 to Avera St. Luke's Hospital in Aberdeen, SD.



At the International

This kind of support will help us reach our \$1,000,000 Beacons goal before 2006. We thank all Beacons for their support. (A complete list of new Beacons can be found in Club News.)

Contributions by clubs and individuals at the Beacons Breakfast in Minneapolis totaled \$83,649.86 which is a new record for contributions at any convention! These contributions break down by \$38,912.86 for INGAP; \$28,315 for Beacons; \$12,200 for the Cosmopolitan Foundation Canada, Inc., with the remainder undesignated or committed to other funds.

Including the contributions on hand and those received at Convention, we are sending \$68,058.30 to the Strelitz Diabetes Institutes for INGAP research bringing our total contributions to \$392,459.54. Additionally, the Cosmopolitan Foundation Canada, Inc. has raised \$105,152 for INGAP bringing the total Cosmopolitan International contributions \$498,034.54 of our total commitment of \$750,000.

Many Cosmos, when asked to think of prospective guests to invite to a new member event, draw a blank. However, new members can be found even in the Yellow Pages. It's much easier to come up with names for a new member event than you might think. For more in-depth information about a new member event, call headquarters and request the newly revised "Seven Steps" brochure to make your Cosmo club grow.

For a new member event, each Cosmo member should think of at least one name for a guest. The more prospective guests the club comes up with, the better chance for new members to join. As the brochure outlines, there are three points to always remember:

- 1. You can't sign up members unless you have guests!
- 2. You can't have guests unless you invite people!
- 3. The guests you have won't join unless they are asked!

#### So how do you start?

- 1. Take blank Application for Membership forms, or use the application portion of the "Unity, Service, Action" brochures, and fill in one name of a potential new member/guest. This form will become an important tool in tracking the guest from receiving an invitation to becoming a member!
- 2. If you don't have a friend or acquaintance who may be interested in attending, use the list at the right and go to the phone book. Use the Yellow Pages to find names of people you know, or even people you don't.
- 3. Each member should provide *at least* one name, and plan to extend an invitation to attend the new member event to their prospective guest *before* the next Club meeting.

It's possible to get 10 or 15 names in a few minutes this way, even if the members don't think they know anyone to invite. At the close of your meeting, ask each member to invite their guest or guests to the new member event. Then at your next meeting, have members report on the success of their invitations.

#### Remember, STOP THE DROP!






