

ederation convention season is just around the corner and I hope you are all planning to attend! For those of you who have never attended or are still undecided, let me take this opportunity to share with you why it's vital that you are there.

FUN and FELLOWSHIP: In today's fast-paced, impersonal world of faxes and e-mails, the federation convention is a great opportunity for members to interact and get to know each other. My wife, Sheila, and I have attended over ten North Central Federation Conventions and, in my capacity as International Officer, I have had the opportunity to attend several other federation's conventions. I can honestly say that once you attend a convention and meet other Cosmo friends, you will not want to miss another!

The length of a convention is left up to each federation. But it has been proven that a two-day convention provides more social time with members and spouses to become better acquainted. Not every discussion has to be a "Cosmo Topic." A Friday night welcome event is a great way to do this. Some federations even hold a Sunday morning breakfast.

Membership Retention Ideas

sually when we think of Membership Retention we concentrate on just getting members involved (to affect or include). Instead, let's try and concentrate on getting members "engaged" (to attract and hold). Traditionally, we tend to link involvement with leadership, however, not all members will take leadership roles. Our goal then should be to try to get every member to participate in some way, (sending cards for birthdays and anniversaries, utilizing phone calling trees, working a fundraiser, publishing a newsletter, web site, etc.).

An alternative or an addition to our "membership committees" could be an "Involvement Committee." The job of this committee would be to monitor club member activity and to contact those members whose activity is low. Ask them why they haven't been attending or participating. Is there something the club can do to help the inactive members be more engaged?

How about trying a Club Activity Competition? Give members "Activity Points" when they participate in any club activity and award a prize to the member with the most points. The Involvement Committee could set up the points and track club activities.

We also make the assumption that people who have been members for a long time will always be members. But of course that isn't necessarily true. At least once a year in your newsletter or web site you should **recognize the members who have been in the club the longest**. They should also be recognized at your awards banquet.

Maybe clubs could try a "How are we doing card?" But not just a simple card where someone can write, "fine." It should be sent to first year members and ask them to give the club a grade. If any area of membership received a grade lower than a "C" the member should be contacted and asked what could be done to improve the grade.

These are just a few ideas to try. Club building and recruiting new members is very important, but I want everyone to remember that we have to retain our current membership if we want to continue to be a strong service club.

I want to pass on a few words to live by: the two most power-filled words....." "I CAN".

Foundation Changes Investment Advisors

At the Cosmopolitan Diabetes Foundation Board meeting last August, the board expressed concern with United Missouri Bank's (UMB) investment results with our portfolio and their service of our account. As a result, the finance committee prepared specifications and put the portfolio management out to bid. We received quotes from four very reputable financial advisor firms, and after careful review, the board unanimously agreed to change investment advisors to UBS as of November 1, 2003.

The transition from UMB to UBS went smoothly, and the Foundation is already seeing improved returns. The market value of our portfolio has risen by almost \$22,000 since UBS has taken over. Some of the improvement is due to a general improvement in the markets, but we are also seeing improvements due to the change in managers. Special attention is being paid to sell poor performing stocks and reinvest the capital in mutual funds, money markets, and other better yielding investments. The Board is very pleased with the UBS performance so far and fully expects to add to our equity position this year. Increases in equity will provide additional margin for any fluctuation in expenses while protecting all contributions made to Beacons as well as our other funds. 
FROM OMAHA...
