Tom was born in Cheyenne, Wyoming and attended St. Marys Catholic High School. There were 91 students in his class. Tom's first job was a paper route that he took from his brother at 10 years old. He did the 49J route with 50 clients. He was paid .50 every 2 weeks and kept the job until he was 19 years old.

Tom attended the University of Wyoming for 2 years and then joined the Air National Guard in Security Forces in Texas and spent a 24 years in the position. He then wen to work for Highway Department and spent 3 years

there. He became a trust officer at a bank and then a state appraiser and Key Bank appraiser for 4 states. He then stated his own business and was self-employed as an appraiser and retired in 2013.

Tom has lived in Cheyenne, Laramie, and Texas.

The most interesting fact about Tom is that he received a pet duck named Homer for Easter and had him for 13 years. He was a Scout Master for Troop 112 and Volunteered for CFD for 60 years!

Tom joined Kiwanis in August 1972 (53 years ago). Will Kalla shared an office with Tom and was his sponsor for the Club.

His favorite memory was being elected President of the Club and at the time the Club had 427 members. He gave money to hire the first Administrative Secretary which was Len Treber. Tom was also part of the Junior Chamber of Commerce which had a similar scope as Kiwanis.

Tom is a Hixson Fellowship, Legion of Honor, Walter Zeller Fellow, Senior Member, Life Member (1996), Past President (1987), Past Lt Governor (1995).

His favorite dinner is Burnt Lobster at the Clam Bake and Apple for dessert.
