Richard Russell

Richard was born in Sidney, Nebraska in 1951. They moved to a farm/ranch north of Pine Bluffs when he was three.

Richard attended school in Pine Bluffs. He started kindergarted there and then graduated from Pine Bluffs High School. He graduated in 1969 with a class of 32 students - 25 of those students started kindergarten with him.

He started working fulltime in the field driving ractors and other things when he was 13. He was up at 5:30, had th etractor going by 7 and back at home between 6 and 7om. He didn't get paid until he was 14 and then as paid \$30 per month. He bought his own clothes and things that he wanted. When he turned 16 and got a car his pay went up to \$40 per month. He then paid for his entertainement and gas. After learning some hard lessons Richard earned an associates degree for LCCC at the age of 27. He later received his BSBA through the University of Phoenix in 1982 - this was before the internet so he drove to Denver for 2 years, once a week for a 4-hour class.

Richard lived in Torrington for 3 years while working on the cnstruction of the Wheatland power plant. He lived in Colorado Springs for 9 months as a foremand for a landscaping crew at Fort Carson. He moved to Cheyenne in 1980 and settled as his current address in 1995.

RIchard used to snow ski, ride morotcycles, and play golf. Now he travles the world, drives convertibles and flies airplanes.

He joined Kiwanis in December 2007 (18 years) and his sponsors were Wayne Herr and Robert Richey. He joined because he was asked by his good friend, Wayne Herr. Right after joining the Club he was asked to help with teh boy scout volunteers at the pancake breakfast and he has been doing that ever since.

Richard is Boy Scout Volunteer Committee Chair, Past Kiwanis Bard Member, Bonham Fellow, and a current Foundation Board Member.

His favorite dinner is a medium rare prime rib with a baked potatoes and side sald with balsamic dressing. For dessert almost any flavor of high butter-fat ice cream.


--1951 introduced the world to Tupperware parties, although the products were first available in 1946. 1947 saw the development of the soft-burping Tupperware seal.
