100th Anniversary - 3 organizations will begin presenting to the Club.

Bob Gross- COVID 19 Fund- We have been very fortunate that Club members have not required much assistance from the Relief Fund. We opted to use United Way as the fiscal agent for the funds. There is a fee that comes with service. We have roughly \$7,000 at United Way. Committee will address these funds to determine best location for funds.

Community Service Requests: YMCA to use cook grill and stove tender

Motion to approve expenditure to purchase Zoom license and Microsoft 365 license for the Club was approved.

President Project - \$10,000 - Brian will use his project money for the 100th Anniversary project.

Approached by local District Governor, The District has been very generous with donations to the Eliminate Program. The District is \$6,800 short of fulfilling it's goal of what was promised. The Sidney Club is very far from meeting goal. We were approached to cover the shortage. The Club will support the Zeller Fellow by matching up to \$3500 to complete the District goal. The money will be given in the Sidney Club's name so that the District can reach the goal. Members who contribute to reach the Zeller Fellow will be given that recognition. Zeller Fellow is \$625 and the Club will match \$625. Funds have to be sent by the end of the month. Let Brian know if you are interested.

We have helped eliminate neonatal tetanus in 59 of 47 countries.

We were recognized as a Distinguished Club.

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## In Person Meetings

### Brain Lenell:

We will have a hybrid, in-person at the Red Lion and at the same time a virtual(zoom) option. I want to make sure that everyone knows the limits and rules so they can make a decision on which option they want to participate. The In-person has several requirements that must be followed or we may have to cancel the in-person option. If you feel that you do not or cannot follow the requirements, I urge you to attend using the Zoom option. We want this to be a safe environment for everyone;

These are the requirements for the in-person meetings, in no particular order;

- Illness or health compromised – If you have any illness that could be transferred to another, or if you feel ill for any reason, please use the Zoom option. If you feel that you may be health compromised, please use the Zoom option.
- Masks – you must wear a mask to the in-person meeting from entering the Red Lion through the entire meeting, except while eating at your table, then while exiting. Although we will have a limited number of masks at the entrance, we ask that you bring your own.
- Tables – the tables will have a limit to the number. Please do not put chairs at your table to increase the number that can sit there. The Red Lion will have them set appropriately.
- Registration – for the in person meeting, we are required to notify the Red Lion by the **Tuesday** before the meeting of the number that will be attending, so they can prepare enough food, and set the tables accordingly. We will send a link through club runner to allow you to register online. You may also call me on my cell # 307-630-3413 and leave me a message if you plan to attend. It is best to use the online registration if at all possible.
- Entrance and attendance sheets – We will have one entrance to the room, with a greeter(s) that will be taking attendance. There will not be attendance sheets on the tables. Please come a little early as there could be a backup at the door. And make sure that you are social distancing while in line. When you reach the greeter, please let them know your full name as it will speed up the process. We have many members and some we know well by first name but not their last name. **AND YOU WILL BE WEARING YOUR MASK!**
- Visiting – please do not try to visit with all of your friends at the meeting. We know that it has been far to long that we have seen each other. Walking from table to table can increase the potential “contamination”. If you wish to meet up with people and they are not at your table, set up a time outside or another location.
- Food – meals will be a buffet style service. All plates will be handled by the waitstaff and given to you at the end of the serving line. When you are done eating, please place your silverware on your plate and the waitstaff will bus tables after the meeting. The waitstaff will not be serving tables directly.
- Name tags, pig and cans – Bring your own name tag if you have one as none will be available. Pig & cans will not be available. Of course, the club and foundation would appreciate the donations if you feel that urge.
- Work in progress – I am sure that we will have to modify some of the rules, add, subtract, and let's hope NOT multiply them. Please be patient with us, we are all trying to make the experience workable and safe for everyone.
