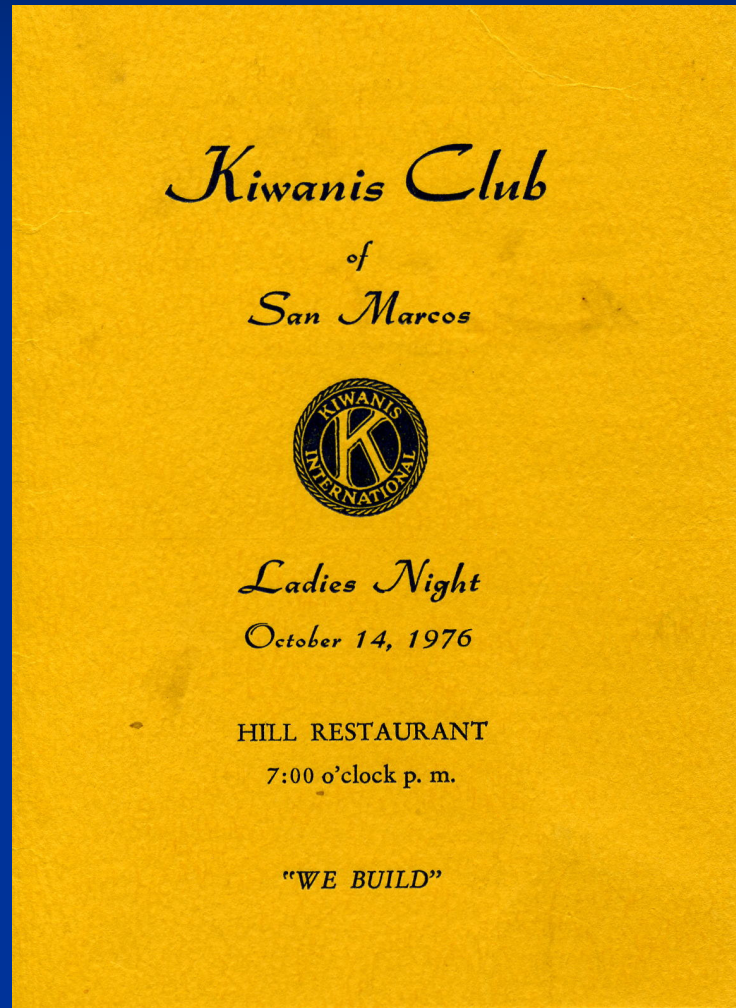

# Annual Pancake Supper - 1939

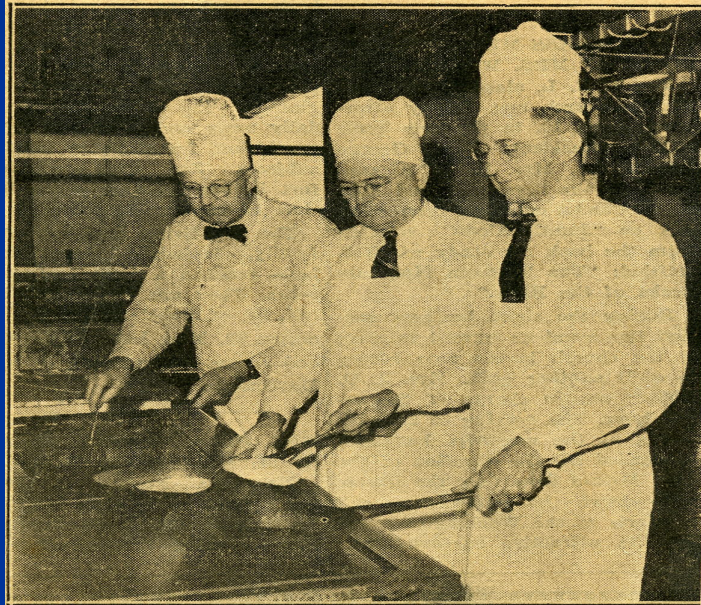
- First Kiwanis Pancake Supper begin in 1939.
- Most of the supplies were donated.
- Tickets were sold for 25 cents.
- Held at City Park Building on San Marcos River from prior to 1960 until 2002.
- Currently held at City Activity Center in conjunction with Annual Silent Auction.
- The Principal source of funds for community support until Radio Auction and TV auction.
- Highly labor intensive.

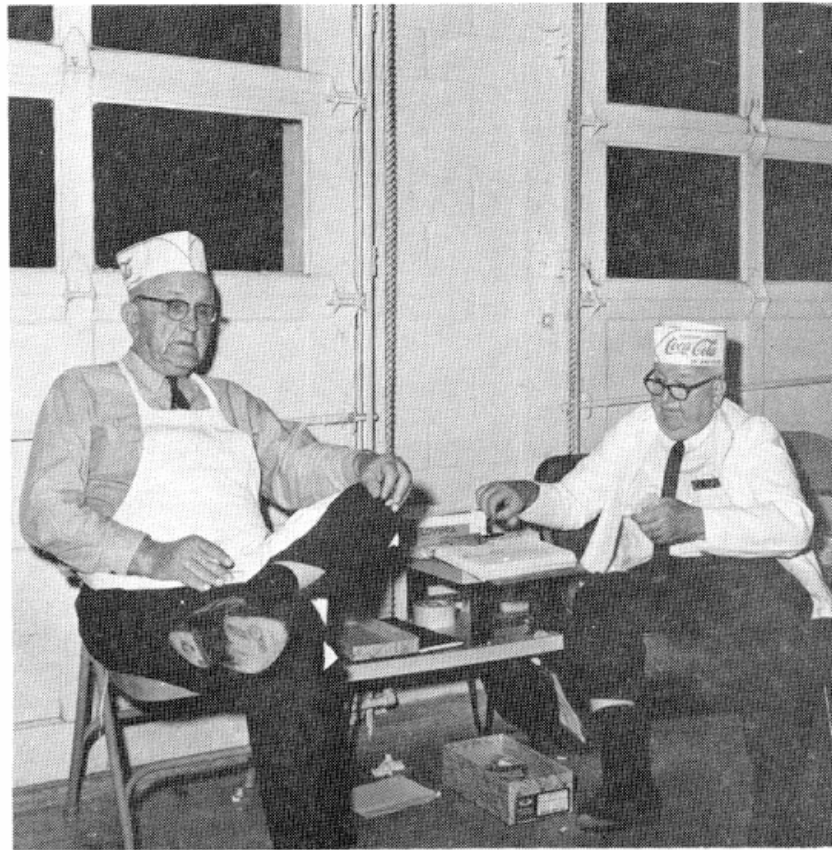

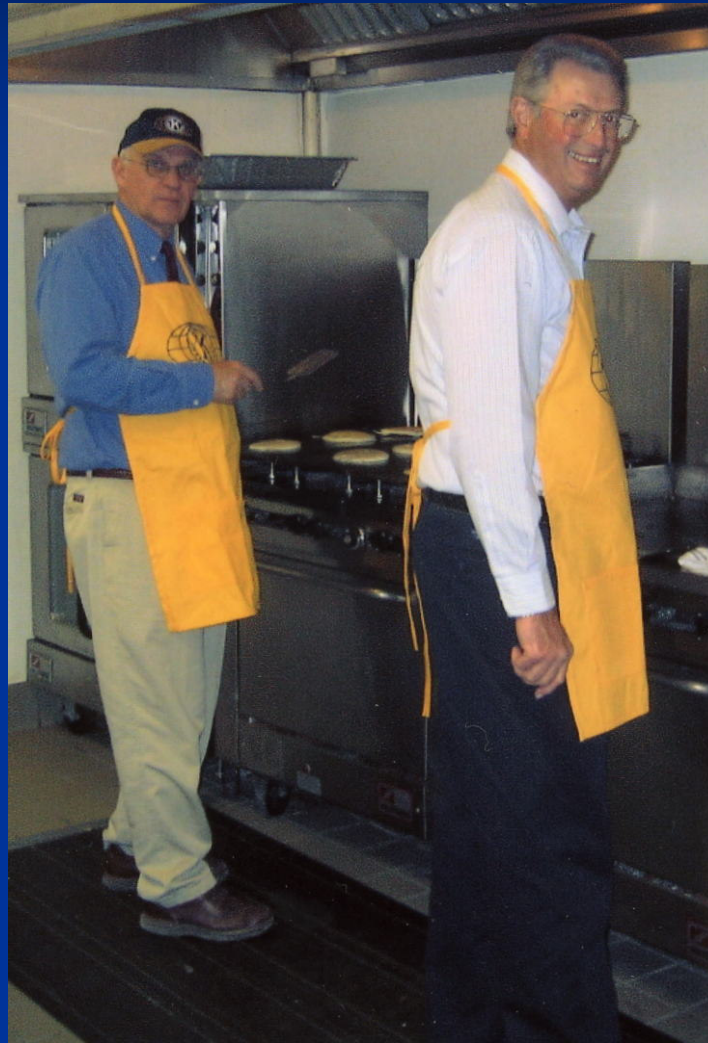
