INTRODUCTION & GUIDELINES

Dear Applicant,

Rotaract is an organisation that is recognised on an international level and is designed for young professionals who want to make a difference. Rotaract is committed to the recognition, practice and promotion of ethical standards such as leadership qualities and vocational responsibilities; developing professional and leadership skills of its members; learning about the needs and opportunities of local and global communities; and serving local and global communities while promoting international understanding and goodwill.

Proudly sponsored by the Rotary Central Cayman Islands and under their guidance we have become the second established Rotaract Club in the Cayman Islands.

The Fred Speirs Vocational Grant (the "Vocational Grant") is for eligible applicants, between 16 and 30 years of age, who are enrolled or accepted into a local or overseas vocational/technical skills course; above and supplemental to high school. Details of eligibility are provided in Exhibit A attached. The Vocational/Technical courses for which this grant may be given include, but are not limited to, courses in pursuit of careers listed in Exhibit B attached.

The amount of the Vocational Grant will be determined by the funds available to Rotaract Blue for this purpose and preference will be given to applicants pursuing certificate courses for which local grants or scholarships are not currently offered.

In order for your application to be considered, the items listed in Exhibit A should be submitted to Rotaract Blue no later than Friday, June 23rd, 2017.

EXHIBIT A : CHECKLIST

The following documents must be submitted in order for your application to be considered:

- Proof of eligibility. Please provide any one of the following:

 (i) Copy of Caymanian passport; or
 (ii) Copy of Cayman Islands birth certificate; or
 (iii) Copy of Cayman Islands status holder or naturalizatio documents
- 2. Letter of reference from a teacher, pastor, employer or other non-relative who can attest to the length of time they have known you and your capability of pursuing the Vocational/ Technical course. The letter should be signed, dated and contain the referee's contact information.
- 3. Copy of high school transcript or transcript from any other schools attended since high school or if you have been out of school for 5 years or more, an explanation about your education and employment experiences during that period.
- 4. Personal statement
- 5. Passport Sized Photograph of applicant
- 6. Proof of acceptance into vocational or technical course
