Meetings in Review

January 5: Our speaker for the Day was Erin Wilson, Afterschool Coordinator and Sharon Mitchell, Executive Director for The Dakota Center. The Dakota center got started back in 1965 by Father Holly. The Da-

kota Center provides an after school program "Homework Club" which is a safe environment for learning. They offer homework assistance tutoring in reading and math, healthy living classes and cooks corner learning, along with exercising and golf and cheerleading and participation in Junior Achievement classes. Students are referred by word of mouth to the program there is a \$25 application fee and most student come from the Dayton Public Schools. They currently have 53 students in the program but can hold up to 60. They can come to the center right after school at 2:30 and stay till 6:00 they are bussed from their schools and parents pick up in the evening. By the end of the year 400-500 kids will pass through the program. They operate through two endowments one that was set up by their founder and they other by Virginia Kettering. They rely on a donor base and contributions to their center. Our Dayton Kiwanis Foundation recently contributed \$2,500 to their programs.

January 19: Our speaker was Pam Albers, Help Me Grow Brighter Futures. Her program service prenatal—age 3 serves 1200 kids a year. Pam spoke to us about a new program they are launching called the Power of Preschool. It has been determined that children who attend preschool are more ready for kindergarten. All kids are screened prior to entering kindergarten to see if they are ready. Those who are ready are 50% more likely to read on grade level by 3rd grade. Preschool is when kids start learning life-long lessons. In Montgomery County almost 2/3 of our kids are not ready for Kindergarten and therefore behind their classmates before they even get started. More kids need to attend a high quality preschool. Therefore the creation of Montgomery County Preschool Promise which would educate families about the power of preschool and assist families based on their needs for covering the costs of preschool and work to expand the number of high quality options available to our community. If you want additional information please see the Learn to Earn website. Preschool is an investment in children, in our workforce and in Montgomery County. By 2018 2 out of every 3 jobs will require education beyond high school.
