Meetings in Review

March 1: Our speaker for the day was Keith Valiquette with Kids in New Directions (KIND) which is a faith-based youth program that was started 21 years ago to provide outreach to at-risk underserved children of

Dayton ages 4-17. KIND has now moved back into one of the Education Building of the original Church where they got their start because it is centrally located with the kids they want to reach. They will soon have an outdoor learning space in a newly formed park when a former building had caught fire and insurance paid out but the church decided not to rebuild but to turn into a greenspace. During the summer KIND served 80-100 kids and about 30-40 during the

school year at their after school programs. They will serve any child whose parent is willing to bring them but mostly they serve those in the 45403 zipcode. Their biggest challenge seems to be developing a strong volunteer base. Bobby Beavers, President, Dayton Kiwanis Foundation presented Keith Valiquette a grant check in the amount of \$1,000 to be used for their reading, math, science and health programs. They provide math tutoring and work with the Boonshoft on Science, serve 5000 meals a year, have a food backpack program, work with K-12 gallery on art and have exercise programs through the YMCA including swimming lessons. K-Donations: From Neal Leffel for his joke and Harry Bradbury for his joke. March 15: Our speaker was Beth Dixon from Power of the Pen and she also had with



her Kim Mueller, Power of the Pen Coach from St Charles School 2 students (7th graders) Grace Bucy and her mother and Maddie O'Neill and her father. Kim started off by telling us why she got involved in coaching after her children were involved in the program while in school. The two students shared with us their "Best of Round" stories written at the local competition one was entitled "Baby Girl" written from the prompt When I was Your Age and they other was entitled "Spiderman" written for the prompt Describe Someone who has had a Major Influence on Your Life". Beth Dixon then told about the Randy Kramer Award of Excellence that has been established for a \$250 scholarship for the top 8th grade writer that our club will fund. Randy's wife and son where there to see the award presented to a student from The Miami Valley School. Our club sponsors the local competition trophies and cash award for the Regional Competition at Wittenberg. We also learned that Wittenberg offers a 40,0000 scholarship to the top 8th grader and Wooster (State Competition Location) offers 3 \$40,000 scholarships. **K-Donations:** From Neal Leffel for his joke of the day and from Kelly Brown for Neal's joke.
