Meetings in Review

May 3: Our speaker for the day was Meredith Florky, Education Director for the Learning Tree Farm. In April of 1973, classroom teachers (the founders Sally Keyes and Jean Ryan) who were concerned about how "out of touch" their students were with the outdoors founded Learning Tree Farm,

Inc. Learning Tree's mission is "to provide hands-on learning experiences in a traditional farm setting." Learning Tree strives to present curriculum based programs in this setting in order to offer a new kind of learning beyond the class-room and its textbooks. It has been serving school children and their families in the Dayton/Miami Valley area, growing from about 200 students in 1973 to over 6,000 in 2006.

Meredith got her start at Learning Tree Farm when she took a preschool class out on a field trip and asked the founders if they had ever thought about having a school there. The Farm is in Jefferson Township and they have 85 acres of farm, field and forest. Most field trips are around 3 hours and the kids can get out and explore. Learning Tree Farm has several programs: Three Season of the Farm and Farm, Fun and Fitness (which is their summer program), and they also have a Saturday Family Fun Program. This fall they will start a Nature-based preschool—enrollment is full and they have a waiting list. They are working on completing the newly acquired building which is connected to the farm. The kids will spend 75% of their time outside. They will attend 2 days a week for 4 hours a day. For more information visit www.learningtreefarm.org

Reports: Chuck Sousa reported that he had 19 volunteers for Special Olympics but it was cancelled due to rain.

May 17: Our speaker for the day was Yvette Kelly-Fields, Executive Director, Wesley Community Center. The center is rooted in the United Methodist Church and has been in the area since 1966. Yvette told us a story about a daughter and mother who came to the center in 1970 for food services because the mother's job was shut down and there the girl got involved in girl scouts and other activities and learned leadership skills. The young girl was Yvette and she told what a difference that the Wesley Community Center had made in her life and what a privilege it was to be back there and leading the organization and making a difference in so many other lives.

Here in 2016 the key areas that they touch on are Education, Workforce Development and Health and Wellness. Workforce Development: work to transition folks out of poverty, work with those who come out of high school with no skills and no work experience, teach them how to go to work and stay on the job and progress at the job. They also work on integrating back into the work force those who have been out of the work force and connect they with partner organizations to get them stable. Health and Wellness: food pantry for those in need (mostly focused on the 45417, 45406, and 45426 zip codes), seniors are transported for lunch and exercise, working with Goodwill Easter Seals on a program aimed at keeping seniors from falling hazards. The food pantry is available to get a weeks worth of food in partnership with the food bank. Also working on a Baby Ready Program because the highest mortality rate in West Dayton is African American babies. They are working with pregnant women to have a healthy baby and offering them many services. Teaching them to eat better and teaching their children to eat better. They also receive instructions on how to make meals with the foods that they receive from the food bank. Also stressing the importance of early literacy and reading to your child. Education: The center has 40-50 young people that come for afterschool support with tutoring and they are provided with meals every day. They are working on the summer ready slide issue which is a real problem especially with children who are already behind. The goal is to teach these children the importance of education in order to break the cycle of poverty.

Yvette shared that most of the staff have their own story to tell about how the center has helped them. They are big believers in collaboration. When asked what do they need help with she indicated that they need additional tutors for the afterschool program.
