### **Meetings in Review**

Our speaker for the day was Casey Petit, Southwest Community Out-June 6: reach Coordinator for the Children's Hunger Alliance which is a state-wide non-profit dedicated to ending childhood hunger in Ohio. 1 in 5 children are affected—575,000 Ohio children live in food insecure households. The Children's Hunger Alliance helps

to provide meals and snacks to 275+ afterschool programs and 900 child care providers. They are working to increase the access to school breakfast and afterschool programs and helping to train child care providers and day care facilities. They also have a summer nutrition program where there are summer meal sites. They provide nutrition education and have an Eat, Play, Grow program where children learn about nutrition and physical activity. Bill Nance acknowledged the 100 mile bike-a-thon for faith and friends radio where they raised fund for the Dayton Gospel Mission. Kelly Brown for an upcoming trip to Spain and France and Kelly also gave a \$50 donation to the foundation in recognition of the retirement of Bobby Beavers.

June 20: Our speaker for the day was Dan Suffoletto, Public Information Supervisor, Dayton & Montgomery County Public Health. Dan covered many areas that Public Health are involved such as the Community Health Plan working on Chronic Disease such as trying to reduce smoking and raise the legal age for tobacco. Get Up Montgomery County is the promotion for kids 5 or more fruits & veggies—2 hours of screen time—1 hour of physical activity and—0 sugary drinks. They are also involved in birth outcomes—reducing preteen birth—reducing infant mortality (black babies dies at a 3x higher rate) - no smoking and drinking while pregnant—center program for expectant mothers. Behavioral Health is also an are of importance—they ensure that access to needed services at the right amount, time and place needed—working on reducing the rate of overdose deaths as this is a large problem in our county. They also have Health Outreach Programs which include health screening, homecare, school nurses and immigration. Their epidemiology department collect and analyze data and monitor, identify and investigate and report health threats. Public Health also does HIV and STD testing, syringe exchange and works on mosquito control. Ticks are becoming more prevalent in Ohio and should be removed asap it takes 24 hours for them to transmit Lyme Disease. They are also involved in Emergency Preparedness and hold regular drills and are responsible for the coordination of all the agencies involved. They also inspect restaurants and public pools. Public Health's overall budget is \$33 million dollars of which 45.4% comes from the Human Services Levy
