

She told the story of a little boy who on his birthday was so excited to get to go to the store and pick out a bag of chips as he told the nurse on the way in. On the way out she noticed he was crying and asked what was wrong the young boy said he didn't get to go to the store now. The nurse, Jennifer went to the store and got the boy a bag of chips and had a piece of cake in her car that she gave to the boy which made him happy as he said he had never had a birthday cake.

How it works:

- We will work with local agencies to identify and vet children—with Brighter Futures being our pilot agency
- Application sent to the Club for consideration (30 days in advance)
- Club will contact Evans Bakery (Bill Evans) who will partner with us on this project.
- Possibly community bakers can also be utilized
- · Agency worker will go along with Kiwanian(s) to deliver the cakes to the kids

Components of the Project:

- Birthday cake (get at cost from Evans bakery—\$5)
- Birthday Card from Kiwanis
- Small gift (if we can get some donations)
- Kiwanis Foundation has approved \$200 for pilot program

Next Steps:

- Meet with Brighter Futures
- Start application process
- Deliver to pilot families
- Evaluate—work out bugs in the process
- Launch the program and alert the media—baking event


100 for 100 Membership Campaign

We are continuing to accept contributions through August 16 (date of our second meeting next month) and just a reminder our Kiwanis Foundation will match your


