### **Meetings in Review**



July 4: No Meeting—4th of July Holiday

July 18: Our speaker for the day was Karl Keith, Auditor for Montgomery County. His office is recognized as top-notch. addressing our club regarding property values in our community. This Summer the audtitor's office will be updating property values in the county as part of the Triennial Update. Auditor Keith addressed the estimated impact of the property values update on our local communities and the county. Once every six years they must do a comprehensive evaluation—mid way through those six years they do a Triennial Update where they look at the market and sales of properties to adjust the values (looking at the sales for 2014, 2015, 2016). They look at sales by neighborhoods which there are over 1200 neighborhoods in the county. They look at comparable housing stock and use natural boundaries. The 2017 preliminary results find that total property value is up by 4.5% with residential up 6.3% and commercial up .5%.

There was a total of a 1.2 billion increase in value in the county. In their 2014 analysis more than 70% of the residential properties decreased in value whereas in 2017 60% have increased 30% are in decline and 10% remain the same. The local real estate market is much healthier during this reporting cycle. Notices will be sent to all property owners before the end of July and they will hold informal reviews in August and September at 15 locations where owners can have a one-on-one meeting to discuss the results if they disagree with the findings. To set up an appointment 225-5096. Values will be finalized in the fall and then that's when they will be sent to the taxation department which will determined your January bill. There are 96 different tax rates in Montgomery County within both residential and commercial properties.
