Other features of the festival include private vendors and area chocolatiers provide an array of themed chocolates for festival guests. In addition to chocolate treats, festival-goers will find merchandise for purchase as well as information about area services and events. The festival stage is the site of live music and entertainment throughout the day. Annual Book Drive to Benefit Brighter Futures Collecting Children's Board Books

We have begun our 9th annual Board Book collection for Brighter Futures under the Help Us Grow Program. *Collection will take place September 1st—December 20th*

Brighter Futures is a comprehensive nurse home visiting program for low income, first time pregnant women. Specially-trained nurses regularly visit mothers and family members in their homes during pregnancy and teach prenatal care. After the birth, they emphasize parenting skills and healthy infant and child development.

We will be collecting <u>Board Books</u> for young children to read and enjoy with their parents. Nurses in the Brighter Futures program leave the books during their visits so that parents can share fun learning moments with their children. Last year we collected around 800 books! Can we match


or exceed that total this year? Let's shoot for 1000 books to distribute to the children!
