Lisa Wagner is the Executive Director for the Levitt Pavilion. The Friends of Levitt Pavilion Dayton Fund are working to bring a new concert pavilion to downtown Dayton. The goal of the Levitt Pavilion Dayton is to transform a neglected green space into a thriving meeting ground for the region, while provide access to the performing arts for all. That's why Friends of Levitt Pavilion Dayton will break ground on a state-of-the-art amphitheater located on Dave Hall Plaza in 2017. This unique partnership between the City of Dayton, Friends of Levitt Pavilion Dayton and the national Mortimer & Mimi Levitt Foundation will create our city's next great outdoor concert venue. Beginning in June 2018, Levitt Pavilion Dayton will present 50 FREE concerts a year featuring local, national and international musicians, with an emphasis on high caliber, diverse programming. The construction of Levitt Pavilion Dayton on Dave Hall Plaza will be a catalyst for economic development in this historic and urban neighborhood of Dayton. In addition, Levitt Pavilion Dayton will become a community asset for other local organizations to showcase their programming and activities, as well as for community celebrations and events.

Meetings in Review

October 3: Our speaker for the Day was Patrick Gill, Executive Director of Montgomery County Ohio College Promise. The organization which was started in 2010 is housed at The Dayton Foundation. Fund Raising efforts for the program began before 2010. 8th grade students are selected and paired with a caring adult all through their

high school years. There is a rigorous 20 page application process for students to participate in the program. Each year 50+ students are chosen to participate in this program with a goal of 500 students over a 10 year period. Those students selected meet once a week with their mentor and upon successful graduation from high school they have the opportunity to attend college on a scholarship for little or no cost to the student or their family. To be eligible students must be on the free or reduced lunch program, have good grades, good attendance, participate in extracurricular activities and have a positive attitude and behavior. Schools currently participating in the program are all Montgomery County Public school districts, Alter, Carroll, Chaminade-Julienne, Dayton Christian, DECA and The Miami Valley School. The expectations are to meet weekly with their mentor, maintain good attendance and grades, stay alcohol and tobacco, drug and crime free, participate in activities and attain a high school diploma. Current College Partners are Sinclair, Kettering College, UD, Wilmington College, Miami, Wright State, Findlay, Central State and Denison. The program is always looking for mentors—our own Bobby Beavers currently serves as a mentor.




