Meetings in Review

Our dear friend, fellow Kiwanian, Past President, and committed Treasurer of our club, Randy Kramer passed away just the day before (November 2nd) after a long and courageous battle with sarcoma cancer. His fight included a leg amputation above the knee six years ago and many trips to the OSU Cancer Center as he continued to fight the tumors returning to his lungs. He handled it all with dignity and grace. Our thoughts go our to his wife Teresa, his children and his entire family. In a moment of sincere appreciation, Kelly asked each of those present to offer their thoughts of how Randy had touched their lives, prior to her invocation. After each personal tribute, even those who never knew Randy very personally, felt that they knew him intimately after listening to all the comments.

The rest of the time was spent in fellowship during the meal and a couple of announcements:

- 1) Chuck Sousa reminded us that he is starting to collect board books, and contributions, for the books for the Brighter Futures Help Us Grow program. Last year we were able to present 400 books. Chuck is looking to increase that number to as many as 700 this year.
- 2) Diane Graham thanked those who turned out to pack over 100 boxes of food for Seniors at the Food Bank last week. Since the Kiwanis Breakfast Club joined us for the project, we are eligible for an interclub with them.
- 3) Kelly Brown reminded everyone to hold the date of Saturday, December 5th, at 10:30 am, for our House of Bread Holiday (Christmas) Gift Project.
- 4) Harry Bradbury reminded the members of the Foundation Board of our meeting following todays luncheon.

November 17: Our speaker was Michelle Riley, President & CEO of The Foodbank. The foodbank has 100 member agencies (all non-profits) who come to them for food to distribute to the citizens of the Miami Valley. These member agencies must distribute the food free to the public through food pantries and congregate feeding. The Foodbank became a stand alone agency in 2004 and will be 40 years old next year...it started as part of the American Red Cross.

We have begun our 8th annual Board Book collection for Brighter Futures under the Help Us Grow Program. Collection will take place October 1st—December


Brighter Futures is a comprehensive nurse home visiting program for low income, first time pregnant women. Specially-trained nurses regularly visit mothers and family members in

their homes during pregnancy and teach prenatal care. After the birth, they emphasize parenting skills and healthy infant and Brighten **Futures** child development.

We will be collecting Board Books for young children to read and enjoy with their parents. Nurses in the Brighter Futures program leave the books during their visits so that parents can share fun learning moments with their children. Last year we collected around 400 books! Can

We will be making the presentation of books to Pam Albers, Executive Director of Brighter Futures in January...so we have plenty of time to collect a record number of books. Books should be new or used in good condition. Board books are the thick cardboard type
