WOODSHOP OUTFITTING

This is an invitation to all OYC members to join a team, to outfit the workshop with equipment and accessories. The shop is in need of a band saw and other misc. equipment, the need to repurpose two of the table saws there now.

The membership is asked to donate any extra hardware and/or boat related equipment currently not in use. The larger equipment will be evaluated or sold to purchase additional equipment as needed. The plan is for members to donate larger equipment to the OYC Foundation (which is a 501 C (3)). The donating member can receive a receipt as a charitable tax deduction if they wish.

The Intent of the project is to maintain hardware on hand for nuisance repairs. We all have made runs to a marine or hardware store to buy six screws when we only needed two, and ended up with screws floating around the boat, or worse, trying to complete a project on a Sunday when stores are closed.

The club has already been offered a drill press, surface planer, routers and rolling storage cabinet(s) for this project by one of our new members Bill Fuller. If you can help out as part of the team?... CSP hours are authorized for this project, so how about GETTING ONBOARD?

Gray Water and the Clean Marina Best Management Practices

I really enjoy going to the boat for lunch during the winter. I fire up the heater and read one of the good books I keep onboard. When I get hungry, I often cook up some tasty stuff. After I enjoy my lunch, I find myself looking at some dirty dishes. If I wash those dirty dishes on the boat, the dishwater will end up in our marina waters. What do the BMP's have to say about that dishwater?

The BMPs tell us to minimize our discharge of gray water. They recommend wiping off all food and grease before you wash dishes and putting the food and grease in the garbage. The BMP's recommend doing as much laundry and showering on shore as you can. What does this look like on our boat? We have an advantage here. We only have a 20 gallon water tank. We never run out of water but do fill it often. My early boats had 5 gallon tanks. The first boat Barb and I had had a 10 gallon tank. Limiting water use is a natural for us. Limiting water reduces gray water. Clean water becomes gray water when you add soap.

Back to my lunch dishes. I don't want to take them home to wash, so I wipe them out with a paper towel. Then I fill a pan or bowl that I used with hot water and add one drop of Dawn dish soap. We use Dawn because it is just soap with nothing else added. We wash the dishes in the pan or bowl. This produces a minimum of gray water to go down the sink. Rinse in hot water and dry. My lunch dishes have been cleaned up and very little gray water is discharged. I take this same attitude towards all gray water on the boat. Minimize the amount of water and the amount of soap used.

It is my hope that minimizing gray water and the amount of soap discharged will reduce the need for additional holding tanks on our vessels. I also hope the careful use of Puget Sound and the connecting waters will preserve this beautiful treasure for our children and grandchildren into the future.

Everybody save Sat. April 19th on your calendar. The OYC Environmental Committee and the Olympia Power Squadron are offering an Environmental and Safety Day at the OYC Mainstation. We are planning to invite West Marine to display and demonstrate their latest environmentally friendly products as well as their newest safety equipment. The Olympia Harbor Patrol and Department of Ecology are also considering taking part.

The History Corner

As shown in last month's column, the OYC has encouraged young sailors from its beginning. The current Juniors Program dates from the 1980s. Longtime member Jill Floberg recalled that at that time the program featured a donated chase boat from her brother-in-law and two donated Lasers (similar to those in the photo). Mike Cahan, Parks Weaver, Bud Tucker, and Gary Burk obtained funds for the program by washing yacht club members' boats, similar to high school car washes. Local kids ages 8 to 18 were recruited and club membership was not a requirement. The objective of this early program was to develop people skills as well as sailing skills.

A few decades later, Bill Wilmovsky, Fleet Captain Sail at the time, encouraged the OYC to expand the program, which was serving only 18-20 sailors. Entrepreneur Jan Visser approached him with a proposal. "Jan Visser was a godsend," Bill recalled, noting that the current Juniors Program's start can be traced to her. She moved a dozen boats from a private corporation she founded 15 years earlier to the OYC. The boats included El Toros (later changed to Optimist Dinghies), Lidos, and Lasers. In 1992 LeRoi Smith was sent to US Sailing Certification class and became one of the first certified instructors involved in club programs on Puget Sound. Today all OYC instructors have Level 1 or Level 2 certifications. Jan served as a board member for US Sailing and continues to serve on committees. Dick Rose of the US Sailing Race Committee donated four Laser 2s to support her efforts. In summary, according to Jill Floberg, "Jan took the program to the next level."

Jan, Bob Connolly, and Rick Antles moved the program from Lidos to 420s, growing a competitive high school program. Notre Dame's sailing program provided the 420s, shipping the boats to East Bay, where the kids sailed them to the OYC. Mike Visser, a two-time US Sailing national champion and Jan Visser's son, came up with the current marketing strategy

through the Olympia Parks Department, who lists the sailing program in its brochures sent to local residents. The Parks Department keeps \$5 dollars of the \$150 student fee and the balance goes to the OYC. Boat washes are no longer held but raffles at the Toliva Shoals Race supplement the fees.

More than 200 kids are now served each year. Success stories include former junior sailor Jeff Causey, who became a rigger on the Oracle team during the most recent America's Cup Race. In a recent interview, Jeff credited his local training, noting that his passion for racing "definitely started when I was growing up in Olympia."
