The Olympia Yacht Club has an accepted offer on the parcel of land immediately south of our present parking lot. Currently this land is used as a parking lot. Although there is not an immediate obvious use to this land, it makes a tremendous amount of sense to me for our

club to acquire this land. If this land is bought, it will more than double the footprint of land the club owns. Most of what we use on a regular basis at OYC, the main station clubhouse and the docks and boathouses, are all built over land (with water on top of it) that we lease from the Department of Natural Resources. The club has a multi-year lease for the right to use this land, but there could come a time in the future where our right to the use of this land might not be granted.

The Yacht Club has been in the same location for 113 years. We like where we are in the heart of downtown Olympia's waterfront. If OYC does not buy the parking lot south of our own parking lot, there may never be another opportunity to do so. Development of Olympia is happening at a pace faster than anything seen here in the last 40 years. Part of the reason for this is the rapid growth of Seattle and King County. The elevated cost of housing in Seattle and King County is causing more development here in Thurston County. If OYC ends up not buying this parcel of land, it won't be long before a residential structure is built there.

A few months ago, I went to meet the City of Olympia's Planning Director Keith Stahley, along with fellow OYC members Tom Skillings, Bob Beckman and Ed Crawford. Keith made it clear to us. We can maintain our main station clubhouse but cannot add to it in any way. It is illegal to do so. If we have other building needs for the club, more offices, meeting rooms, storage, parking, it can only be built on terra firma. That's why I think it makes so much sense to purchase the land south of us. It allows us to control our future destiny.



#### Property Purchase Update

As I write this article, we are engaged in an environmental survey of the property (the parking lot next to our parking) that we are intending to purchase. We should have test results in early June. These results will assist in determining how we move forward.

Recently an OYC member stepped forward and has offered a significant loan to the Club to acquire the property. With this support, and yours, we can avoid going to a financial institution for a mortgage. In order to achieve this end, we need a number of us to also step forward and purchase a loan note to support the purchase. If 30 of us loaned the Club \$10,000 each, we can entirely self-finance the acquisition. We will be offering interest rates above what you are currently receiving but less than what a bank would charge. More information to come on this program, but start giving some thought to being part of this important investment in the future of OYC.

#### Sailing Education and the OYC Racing Team

OYC has a very successful Youth Sailing Education program during the summer months that has put nearly 300 young sailors on the water each summer. In addition, we have a high school racing program that has become very successful and recognized as a team to be reckoned with on the racing circuit.

This program has become a big, growing part of OYC. Unfortunately, our bylaws, financing, infrastructure, and general Club support has not matured as rapidly. Consequently, the Board has established a temporary task force to examine the relationship and integration of these programs within the OYC family. This task force will make recommendations on changes necessary to fully integrate these two valuable programs within the OYC organizational structure.

We are actively seeking members for this task force. The task force is asked to report to the Board this Fall. #### **Property Acquisition Vote Coming Soon**

The Olympia Yacht Club has a far-reaching decision to make – whether or not to acquire the parking lot south of its facility and ensure the club's viability into the future.

As you may know, the OYC Board has offered to buy the lot and will need approval of its members to complete the purchase following satisfactory resolution of possible environmental concerns. A vote will be scheduled as soon as the environmental review is completed and any issues worked out with the seller and city.

## Two thirds of those members who cast a vote will need to approve the purchase before the Board can purchase the property.

So far, member response to the potential purchase has been positive. They see the value of owning the property between our current parking lot and the street. They understand that the current clubhouse sits above state waters, and there is no guarantee that the Department of Natural Resources will continue to allow the club to use that space forever. Our current lease expires in 2027. Coupled with continuing city pressures to expand waterfront access, and limited ability to expand the current clubhouse, buying land adjoining our property makes sense and is an opportunity that won't be repeated.

The Board has offered \$1.1 million for the three-quarters of an acre, which may seem like a lot but is in line with other recent purchases of commercial property in the vicinity.

Members may ask how the club will pay for the property, and there the news is good. Fiscal analysis shows that the club is in such good shape financially that the acquisition can be financed with only inflationary increases in current assessments. We've even been approached by club members willing to loan the club money to make the purchase. As other members participate in this loan, financing won't be a problem. The purchase can be paid off in 10 years.

What you may ask would be done with the property once acquired? That's not a decision we need to make now or in the near future. Initially, we would manage it as a commercial parking lot as it is now being used and generate revenue.

At some point, we might entertain a joint venture with a developer to build a combination clubhouse and commercial facility. Or we might build our own standalone clubhouse. But the biggest advantage is acquiring this property gives us a greater say in the development of the Isthmus.

If we don't buy the property, someone else will, and then its development is out of our control and any future expansion of the club is foregone.

Let's think ahead, as our predecessors did in the 1970s when they purchased Island Home. Their vision and dedicated work has given us a place that we all value and enjoy. Today we have another opportunity to look into the future and preserve OYC for a second 100 years.

### **Stretching**

Another "use it or lose it" pertains to our flexibility and that is both in a physical and mental sense. Remember how your kids could bend like pretzels and not even have difficulties getting out of bed the next morning? As we age, the cumulative effect of minor or major injuries, arthritis, day to day bumps, and couch-potato-ism makes us less and less flexible. Something as simple as leg, hip, back and arm stretching before and after even simple tasks goes a long way to preserving our function.

Consider Yoga. I have been doing yoga for 3 years now and highly recommend it to restore your joint flexibility and balance. I can't push the importance of balance too much considering that we all wander around tippy boats and falls can cause injuries. Try just standing on one leg at a time daily and see how you can increase your balance with time. There seem to be a zillion forms of yoga all with strange sounding Indian names. Find one that goes with your lifestyle or adapt their poses to your workouts. Remember to adjust your poses to your own limitations. Part of the exercise is a short period of meditation where you empty out the daily hassles and center yourself. Very refreshing.



#### Reciprocal Moorage

Before you slip your lines from the dock for your departure for your next extended cruise; or you just want to visit a new location, be sure to review your options with our reciprocal clubs. The Olympia Yacht Club currently has reciprocal agreements with 120+ Yacht clubs. To access the list of these clubs, their locations, and current rules, go to the web site <a href="YachtDestinations.org">YachtDestinations.org</a>. You will need to sign-in and establish your account with your password. This will give you access to the most current information with our reciprocal clubs.

When you use your reciprocal privileges:

- Always fly your burgee and carry your OYC membership card. In Canada, fly a Canadian courtesy flag.
- Remember that you are liable for any loss of damage incurred while a guest and that boats must not be left unattended overnight without permission.
- Some clubs, especially in Canada, now require proof of insurance.
- Again check with the reciprocal club for details, holiday restrictions, etc.



#### Boat Registration Renewal Frequently Asked Questions

#### When do boat registrations expire in Washington?

All boat registrations in Washington expire on June 30.

#### Why do boat registrations expire on the same day every year?

State law (<u>RCW Chapter 88.02</u>) and Department of Licensing (DOL) rules (<u>WAC 308-93-060</u>) determine the length and dates of the boat registration period, which begins on July 1 and ends on June 30 of the following year.

#### When can I renew my boat registration?

Boat registrations that are current can be renewed starting January 1 for the upcoming registration year (beginning July 1).

#### How can I renew my boat registration?

Renewing your boat registration has never been easier. Boat owners can renew their boat registrations <u>online</u>, at <u>one of eight local licensing subagencies located across Thurston County</u> or directly at the Thurston County Auditor's Office in Olympia.

If you renew online through DOL, there is no additional cost and you have the choice of receiving your registration through the mail or picking it up at the local Thurston County subagency of your choice. You can also renew in-person at one of the eight local licensing subagencies or directly at the Thurston County Auditor's Office and receive your registration at the time of transaction.

#### What happens if my boat registration expires?

Boat owners caught driving a boat with an expired registration are subject to a \$125 ticket.

#### What if I didn't renew last year?

If your registration has expired, you must first renew for the current year (ending June 30) before renewing for the upcoming year (beginning July 1). For example, if your boat registration has expired and you renew in 2017, your renewal will only be valid through June 30, 2017. If you only want to renew for the upcoming year, you may wait until July 1 or afterward to renew.

## **2017 Adult Classes**

## Adult Keelboat Sailing Classes

Keelboats are generally 16 feet and up and have an attached keel that cannot be raised and lowered. Larger cockpits allow ease of movement for most adults and are looked upon favorably by those of us with stiff, creaky joints. Keelboat sailing is a class we offered last year using the club's new J 24 keelboat and because of its popularity, we enlisted the help of Olympia Yacht Club Skippers who provided a variety of their own boats for this class. This proved to be a great class model that we are repeating this year. If you are thinking of buying a sailboat, as new boat owners with little or no experience, you are encouraged to take these classes to gain knowledge and experience before heading off on your own excursions. These classes will introduce you to sailing terminology, and we will help you identify how they apply on different types of boats. You will become familiar with how to find wind, specific knots used on the boats, the concepts of points of sail and sail trim and hands-on experience in applying them to get you where YOU want to go. Our Basic classes include 12 hours of instruction, our Introductory classes include 6 hours of instruction.

We have set up our summer classes, so you can start with an intro or basic class and continue sailing through the summer by taking an advanced class or the Sailing to Hope Island class increasing your skills and experience as the summer progresses. Fair Winds!

## **Basic Keelboat Sailing** 12 hours of Instruction

This class will cover the basics of sailing and incorporate more on-the-water hands-on practice for students to acquire confidence and experience. We will cover boat rigging, knots, points of sail, sail trim, finding wind and give each student time to learn the various roles that a skipper and crew fill.

We will also cover rules of the road and use of navigation aids for safely traveling from our moorage slips out into the harbor for our outings. This is a great beginning class for anyone who has the dream of someday owning their own boat and cruising in the Puget Sound area. You will get a full 12 hours of class with most of it being on the water.

For those wanting more practice and experience, this is a class that you can repeat.

The number of boats available for this class will be determined by the number of participants who sign up. I will try to keep our ratio of students to boat owners low, so everyone gets a chance to experience participating as a crew and helmsperson.

## **Advanced Keelboat Sailing**

#### 12 hours of instruction per class

This is not a beginner class, so you need to have previous sailing experience either by attending an Intro or Basic class or from previous experience. This Advanced Keelboat Sailing class will include a review of the basics and introduction to the different systems that keelboats all use to get you from place to place.

Our review will include standing rigging, running rigging, points of sail, sail trim. You will have time for practicing skills learned in previous classes or prior experience on keelboats. We will practice tacking, gybing, reefing sails and overboard drills. We will also introduce you to Systems used for safety such as VHF radios, and anchoring. You will also be introduced to reading charts and shown how to plan a day-long trip. Our discussions will cover how to un-ground a boat, safety tips and knowledge that only comes from personal experience. This is a class designed to provide you with a step-up to cruising our local waters safely.

## Sailing to Hope Island or Island Home

This class is for students who have either personal experience or have attended our Advanced Keelboat Class. We will take your knowledge and apply it to actually going somewhere and getting home again. This class will include one three-hour session and one day-long session to historic Hope Island, 6 miles from Olympia just off the end of Steamboat Island. Hope Island is a beautiful water-accessonly State Park whose history includes truck farming and is the original home of the Island Belle grape grown in the early part of the 1900s. Deer, otter, sea life, eagles and shell fish abound.

If the wind is favorable or the current next to Hope Island is too strong for anchoring, we will continue two miles farther North to OYC's beautiful outstation, Island Home. This small island is just south of the Hartstene Island bridge and North of Hammersly Inlet. It is owned and operated by the Olympia Yacht Club and open to OYC members year round.

We will plan and execute our trip using tide and current charts, hopefully with enough wind to sail. You will gain experience in anchoring, docking or picking up mooring buoys We will tow an inflatable boat with us to provide shore access if we stop at Hope Island.

Greetings all.




