3301-51-10 Transportation of children students with disabilities.

(A) Definitions.

(1) The term disabilities includes the following: -autism, deaf-blindness, deafness. impairment, cognitive disability, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other health impairment, serious emotional disturbance, specific learning disability, speech or language impairment, traumatic brain injury, visual impairment including blindness, and any other conditions as identified in division (A) of section <u>3323.01</u> of the Revised Code. (5e) Alternative pick-up and drop-off locations, such as the curb, driveway, or front door of the child's student's home, if determined to be appropriate based upon the individual needs of the childstudent. (6f) Other travel that may be arranged by the school district with no reimbursement from the state. (7) Weekend travel on Saturday or Sunday for residential schools is permitted. (4) School district means city, local, exempted village, educational service center, community school, STEM school, boarding school, or county board of developmental disabilities, for purposes of this rule. (B) State residential schools.

<u>(1) This paragraph refers to the Ohio state school for the blind and the Ohio state school for the deaf.</u>

 $(\underline{12})$ Reimbursement for transportation to and from the school district of residence shall be approved by the department for eligible <u>children_students</u> with disabilities placed in <u>state</u> <u>residential schools</u>, <u>including</u> the Ohio state school for the blind and the Ohio state school for the deaf.

(23) Reimbursement claims for weekend travel and/or daily travel shall be approved by the department for eligible <u>children_students</u> with disabilities placed in <u>state residential schools</u>, <u>including</u> the Ohio state school for the blind and the Ohio state school for the deaf.

(C) Eligibility.

(1) Reimbursement for special education transportation <u>shall be done may be approved by the</u> department's office of pupil transportation for children with disabilities attending a special education program approved by the department's office for exceptional children, and/or attending a regular class in a public school. in accordance with O.A.C. 3301-83-01(D).

(2) School district transportation personnel shall be consulted in the preparation of the individualized education program[EP based upon the unique needs of the student when transportation is required as a related service and when the child's needs are such that information to ensure the safe transportation and well being of the child is necessary to provide such transportation.

_(3) When required by the individualized education program, transportation will be provided based upon the unique needs of an individual child.

(<u>34</u>) A community school governing <u>beard authority</u> shall provide or arrange transportation free of any charge for any <u>disabled</u> student <u>with disabilities</u> enrolled in the school for whom the student's <u>individualized education program IEP</u> specifies transportation <u>in accordance with O.R.C. 3314.091</u>.

(45) For transportation purposes, a child student with disabilities that is parentally placed in a attending a nonpublic school, placed by parent, guardian, or others, shall be entitled to transportation the same as any child student without disabilities attending a nonpublic school in accordance with section 3327.01 of the Revised Code.

(D) General requirements.

(1) Each school district shall establish its own reasonable travel time. Travel time is defined as beginning at the initial pickup of the child and ending with the final arrival at the school destination.

The school district shall develop its travel time standard, approved by the <u>individual-that district's</u> board of education, and shall consider the following factors: age of <u>the childstudent</u>, <u>condition-type</u> of disability, geographic size of <u>the school district</u>, location of <u>the special education class</u>, traffic patterns, and roadway conditions.

(2) Those who transport eligible children students with disabilities must comply with the appropriate provisions of the rules <u>3301-83-03</u> to 3301-83-24 of the Administrative Code.O.A.C. Chapter 3301-83.

(3) Drivers and transportation aides must have access to appropriate information about the <u>child</u> <u>student</u> to the degree that such information might affect safe transportation and medical wellbeing <u>while being transported during transport</u>. This information must be accessible in the school transportation office and is confidential.

_(4) Emergency evacuation and other pertinent safety precautions must be considered by school districts deciding upon the appropriate transportation services for children with disabilities.

(5) All vehicles used must be authorized vehicles as defined in rule <u>3301-83-19</u> of the Administrative Code. A privately owned vehicle <u>of the family</u> utilized to transport a <u>pupil-student</u> of the family is not subject to <u>O.A.C. Chapter 3301-83 or</u> regulations other than that required by state law.
