Camp Dreamcatcher wasn't held this summer because of COVID concerns, and needless to say, we had 160 very disappointed campers and staff members. It was decided to use donation/grant funding from Altrusa to send everyone a DREAMCATCHER FOREVER "camp-in-a-box."

Custom-printed boxes were filled with goodies to remind campers of the fun and traditions of camp week. The large white box printed with DREAMCATCHER FOREVER was mailed to each child...as a gigantic surprise. It was so touching to receive thank-you texts and notes and calls along with photos and videos of the campers' reactions! We were able to deliver some of the summertime magic each child experiences at camp.

Included in each box: a camp fire, beach towel, aluminum water bottle, fanny pack, back pack, arts/crafts, cooking supplies (recipes, measuring spoons, measuring cups), luggage tags, sunglasses, journal, beach ball, frisbee, camp hat, glow necklaces, printed games and word finds, custom-printed pillowcase and fabric markers, face gaither, camp bracelet, keepsake box, Dreamcatcher kit, cabin flags, and t-shirts. We also customized boxes by cabins such as fairy accessories for the youngest girls cabin and superhero gear for the 2 younger boys' cabins. For the oldest cabins, we added a rock/stick combination which symbolizes hope and fear. Those campers have a very solemn camp fire one night where they share their fears (sticks are thrown in the fire to burn as a gesture of letting go) and their hopes (rocks to take home and hold on to).

Altrusans helped to organize, pack, label and seal the boxes: Susan Cory (3 hours), Diana Zaremba (4 hours), Brenda Hill (4 Hours), Julie Ruiz (6 hours), Debbie Fendrick (10 hours), Regina Phinney (4 hours) and Susie Dawson (4 hours).

It was such a JOY to work on this project and to witness the thrill of the campers as they opened their boxes at home.
