

Americans think their distrust of the federal government and each other is a problem that gets in the way of solving issues.






Personal trust ranges across a spectrum, with differences in levels of trust tied to race and ethnicity, age, education, and household income.












COVID-19: THE IMPACT

Americans are hungry for responses to the crisis guided by ingenuity, resilience, and grace.

A **poll** by More in Common and YouGov in late March found that:

90 percent of Americans feel "we are all in this together," and 82 percent believe "we have more in common than what divides us"


—numbers that have grown substantially over the last year within every shade of partisan belief. More Americans believe they can *count on one another* and report greater worries about the "American people's health" than about the health of their own families.




PR Bond Percentage Point Change from CY 19 to CY 20
