GOLDEN RULE AWARD **Jim Reese, President and CEO** **Atlanta Mission**

"Ending Homelessness, One Friend at a Time"

Jim Reese is President and CEO of Atlanta Mission, headquartered in Atlanta, Georgia. He joined the organization in August 2008. Before joining Atlanta Mission, he was a member of the Executive Board of Netherlands-based Randstad Holding NV, and the CEO of Randstad North America with oversight for Randstad United Kingdom. Other positions held at Randstad were COO of North America and Managing Director of Operations for North America's Southeast Division.

Prior to joining Randstad, Reese worked for the Honeybaked Ham Company, Frito-Lay and General Food's Maxwell House Coffee Plant, in Jacksonville, Florida – "the world's largest coffee plant." In 1989, Reese co-founded the First Coast Manufacturers Association, which today includes more than 300 Florida manufacturers.

Reese has addressed audiences at Yale University in New Haven, Connecticut and at Western Michigan University, and at various business conferences on a variety of leadership and business ethics topics. He earned his B.B.A. from Western Michigan University in Kalamazoo. He is a board member of several companies including the Chick-fil-A Foundation and D&W Fine Pack, a member of the Downtown Rotary Club and a leader in his church.

Reese lives in North Atlanta with his wife, Dina. They have three daughters, two son-in-laws and four grandchildren.

INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS AWARD **Dr. Thomas Frieden, MD, MPH** **Director, CDC**

Tom Frieden, became Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in June 2009. He has worked to control health threats from infectious diseases, respond to emergencies, and battle the leading causes of suffering and death in our nation and around the world.

He is leading our nation's health protection agency to address these challenging health priorities.

1. Improving health security at home and around the world – by preparing for, detecting, rapidly responding to and preventing health threats 24/7 to save lives and safeguard communities. These include global disease threats, antimicrobial resistance, foodborne illness and health care-acquired infections.
2. Reducing the leading causes of death and illness – by focusing on reducing disease that sap the quality of life and longevity of Americans, including tobacco, uncontrolled blood pressure, diabetes, obesity, physical inactivity, motor vehicle safety, prescription drug overdoses, and HIV/AIDS.
3. Strengthening public health & health care collaboration - by aligning, coordinating and integrating public health and health care to improve health outcomes.

A physician with training in internal medicine, infectious diseases, public health, and epidemiology, Dr. Frieden is especially known for his expertise in tuberculosis control. He has received many awards and honors and has published more than 200 scientific articles. He graduated from Oberlin College, received both his medical and master's degrees from Columbia University and completed infectious disease training at Yale.
