ALFREDO ORTIZ, President and CEO Job Creators Network

"Defending Your American Dream Through Employee Education!"

Alfredo Ortiz has been the President and CEO of Job Creators Network since January 2014. He is also a board member for the Georgia Chamber of Commerce and an advisory board member for Littler's Workplace Policy Institute.

He has testified before legislative committees about the impact of bad government policy on job creation, and speaks frequently to business organizations across the nation about the need for job creators to seize responsibility for defending free enterprise, both in the communities where they live and their workplaces. His advocacy for the voice of job creators has appeared in many newspapers such as the *Detroit Free Press*, the *Las Vegas Review-Journal* and the *South Florida Business Journal*. He is a frequent guest on radio talk shows, including the nationally syndicated Dennis Prager Show.

Prior to joining JCN, Alfredo was Vice President of CSM Bakery Products' Food Service Division, a \$2 billion global food company, where he was responsible for increasing national account penetration five-fold and leading a major broker realignment and trade system implementation. Alfredo was also a consultant at Boston Consulting Group in their Washington of-fice, and has worked in marketing, new product development and corporate strategy for Georgia Pacific, Kraft and others. Alfredo received his MBA from the University of Michigan and his bachelor's from Pomona College.

"Reinventing College for the 21st Century: Agnes Scott's Summit Initiative"

Dr. Elizabeth Kiss became the eighth president of Agnes Scott College in August 2006. Before coming to Agnes Scott, she was the Nannerl O. Keohane Director of the Kenan Institute for Ethics and associate professor of the practice of political science and philosophy at Duke. Previously she taught at Princeton University, Randolph-Macon College and Deep Springs College.

A graduate of Davidson College, Dr. Kiss received a B.Phil. and D.Phil. in philosophy from Oxford University in England. A Rhodes Scholar, she has held fellowships at the Harvard Program in Ethics and the Professions, the National Humanities Center and Melbourne University's Centre on Applied Philosophy and Public Ethics. She specializes in moral and political philosophy and has published on moral judgment and education, human rights, ethnic conflict and nationalism, feminist debates about rights and justice and justice in the aftermath of human rights violations. She co-edited and contributed to *Debating Moral Education: Rethinking the Role of the Modern University*.

Dr. Kiss is a member of many civic and professional organizations and is a trustee of Duke University and the Woodruff Arts Center. A 2016 recipient of a POW! Award honoring purposeful women from Womenetics, Dr. Kiss has received several awards from many women and girls organizations. Her husband, Jeff Holzgrefe, is an academic whose focus is international relations and ethics.
