Since beginning as GSU's seventh president on Jan. 1, 2009, Mark Becker has launched a 10-year Strategic Plan, whose mission is to position Georgia State "as a dynamic academic community where teaching and research combine to produce leaders and create solutions to conquer the challenges of the 21s century." Becker implemented many initiatives for GSU including launching the Second Century Initiative for faculty excellence, enhancing it's global reach and leading a diverse university whose excellent graduate programs enjoy strong national rankings.

Becker also has overseen a number of physical improvements and enhancements including the opening of the Parker H. "Pete" Petit Science Center and the purchasing of land for future growth and expansion in downtown Atlanta.

Prior to his appointment to GSU, Becker served in positions at the universities of South Carolina, Minnesota, Michigan, Washington and Florida and Cornell University.

Becker earned his bachelor's degree in mathematics from Towson State University and his doctorate in statistics from the Pennsylvania State University. Active in the Atlanta community, Becker is a member of many organizations including the Central Atlanta Progress Executive Committee and Atlanta Committee for Progress Board of Director. Becker and his wife, Laura Voisinet, have two grown children, Matthew and Julia.
