Today's Program - Rob Hermanson, President of the Cherry Creek Optimist Club and Director of the Schlessman YMCA, was our speaker today. Dob talked to us account the Y's sustaining fund-raising efforts among the 10 branches in the Metro Denver area. 4,000,000 dollars of funds raised will be used to renovate existing buildings and facilities. The most exciting expansion to our members is the coed not tub. Some of the Y's funding comes from the United Way, but much of it comes from other sources, including the annual sustaining campaign. The Schlessman Y will be expanding in preschool and day care center. \$23,500 of this year's budget will be used for youth scholarships. Through youth and government programs, the center has helped high school students. In addition to its regular programming focusing on youth, gymnastics, teenage and adult fitness, the Schlessman Y provides assistance to the Sioux Indians of North Dakota and the Mexican Federation organization. Rob mentioned that last year Tom Mauro got 90 persons to contribute to the Y's financial campaign. Founded in 1844, the YMCA has been working to build body, mind, and Christian spirit. I knew a man named Bob Hansen when we were both in the Cherry Creek Kiyanis Club. With his recent passing the Y has lost a man who, along with his father, dedicated his life to the growth and development of the YMCA. Many of you knew this man who led a vigorous, humorous, and dedicated life, a life he spent in service to others as the rent for the space he occupied on earth. I can still hear that chuckle and remember that wry grin. 'nough said.
