Today's Program - John Moser introduced Bob Anderson (not the CU football hero of yesteryear), who spoke to us about Improvements in the treatment of Alcoholism, a disease which afflicts at least 18,000,000 Americans. Bob, whose business is converting people from alcoholism, presented some very stark statistics about the effects of alcoholism in other areas. Behind heart attacks and cancer it is the 3rd major health problem in America. In his work and research at Cottonwood Treatment Center, Bob has learned that that (1) 60 to 70% of our prison inmates are incarcerated because of alcohol-related crimes, (2) Cirrosis of the liver is the third leading cause of death in our country, behind heart attacks and cancer, (3) 50% of persons on our welfare relief programs have been affected by or are dependent upon alcohol, (4) job loss

attributed to alcoholism results in 50% of all police activity, kills 25,000 people and injures another 100,000 people every year, is a factor in 65% of all murders and 38% of all rapes. In spite of this gloomy data, AA has cured (or stopped from drinking) 200,000,000 people worldwide. I can still remember that spring night of my senior year in high school when I chug-a-lugged my first quart bottle of 3.2 beer as Frank and Jim and I American Graffitied our way down Colorado Blvd. around Celebrity and circling Shakey's and back and forth. The downtownies would cruise up and down 15th and 16th Streets honking horns in their shiny '55 Chevys or their fathers' Buicks. There wasn't much traffic in SE Denver in 1964, or policement either, except the speed trap in Glendale. Those were the days! This summer, at our 20th year reunion, we still hadn't picked up any girls on Colorado Blvd, but Jim and Frank each had two - around ages 9 and 12.
