This Date in History

Below are some notes from this date in history:

- April 14, 1828: The first edition of Noah Webster's \rightarrow "American Dictionary of the English Language" is published.
- \Rightarrow April 14, 1841: The first detective story is published. Edgar Allan Poe's "Murders in Rue Morgue." It has been recognized as the first modern detective story; Poe referred to it as one of his "tales of ratiocination."
- April 14, 1865: President Abraham Lincoln is shot. \Rightarrow President Lincoln is shot and mortally wounded by John Wilkes Booth during a performance of "Our American Cousin" at Ford's Theater in Washington.
- April 14, 1910: President William Howard Taft be- \Rightarrow gins the tradition of the ceremonial first pitch. President Taft throws out the ceremonial first pitch of

 \Rightarrow April 14, 1965: 173rd Airborne Brigade ordered to South Vietnam. The Joint Chiefs of Staff order the deployment of the 173rd Airborne Brigade — the first major U.S. Army ground combat unit — from Okinawa to South Vietnam. The 173rd arrived in Vietnam in May 1965.

Michelle Jeske Denver City Librarian, Denver Public Library

Our speaker today was <u>Michelle Jeske</u>, the Denver City Librarian. Michelle has been speaking to numerous community groups promoting modern library features, benefits, and services.

Michelle has been with the Denver Library system for about fifteen years and has come up the ranks to become Denver Public Library's new City Librarian. She has been in that position for about two years. Michelle

served in a number of positions prior including the Manager of Web Information Services and Community Technology Center, Senior Special Collection Librarian for the Library Without Walls, and as the director of Collections, Technology and Innovation.

Michelle gave a slide presentation with some pretty interesting facts about the Denver Library System, for example:

- The Denver library system gets 4.3 million visitors annually, which is twice the number of people who visit the zoo.
- ◊ There are an additional 13 million visits online.
- ◊ 400,000 people attend programs.
- 0 44,000 kids participate in the summer reading program.
- ◊ 670,000 hours of public computer use.
- 3,000,000 wireless sessions (people with their own devices, but need Wi-Fi).
- ◊ 69% of Denver residents have a card.

The Denver Library was founded in 1889 and operates independently of the city. In June 1889, City Librarian John Cotton Dana established Denver's first public library in a wing of Denver High School. Between 1913 and 1920, Carnegie also underwrote construction of the city's first eight branch libraries. They would serve a growing city that had previously relied on traveling trunks of books. The library commission has eight commissioners appointed by Mayor. The commission serves as the Board of Directors for the Library and has exclusive control of the public library system.

Over 127 years, there have only been ten city librarians. Michelle is in her second year. There are 26 library locations and two bookmobiles.

The library's vision statement is "An Inspired and Engaged Denver." The programs are designed to not only help develop readers but skills in other areas as well. Recently they have added two social workers to their staff to assist with the homeless or others who need to find resources and are in need of social services.

Having a Library Card opens up a lot of resources, and you do not have to be a Denver resident to use Denver libraries programs — any library card will do.
