**Tom Kramis** gave the Board an update on plans for the 2020 Christmas Tree lot. Tom has to place an order with our out-of-state tree providers by June 1<sup>st</sup>. With the ongoing COVID-19 crisis, there was a lengthy discussion about how conservative we may need to be with placing the order for trees, given the economic uncertainty we are facing.

Tom provided a similar update to the Club membership at Friday morning's Zoom meeting. Tom is looking for members who want to be part of a "Strategic Planning" committee for the 2020 Christmas Tree lot. If you are interested in helping out, please let Tom know.

The Board heard a report from Club Treasurer **Greg Young** about the Denver East High School's Constitutional Scholars team, which is a two-time defending national champion. With school closings, there will not be a 2020 national championship competition. The Club has already made a 2020 donation to the East High team, and the team sponsor thanked us for the donation.

The Board also kicked around the idea of doing a Zoom "New Member Orientation" for the last half dozen or so new members. I will be working with **Tom Glazier** and **Jim Easton** to see if we can pull that off. We want to make sure that we make the new members feel involved and inform them about the Club's many youth projects and activities that we hope to resume later in 2020.

At Friday's meeting, **Joe Marci** announced that he has received six applications for the Sullivan Scholarships and is working with Thomas Jefferson High School to secure more.

During the meeting (and with a couple of later emails), Joe reported that we have a nearly full slate of officer nominees for Club Year, October 2020 to September 2021. The nominees' names are posted elsewhere in this week's GUMS. The Club needs to hold elections and get the results to OI before the end of May...if not sooner. We will provide updated information at next Friday's membership meeting.

**Tom Hoch** told a couple of Ole/Sven/Lena jokes. **Bob Avery** tried telling a joke, but it was pretty long and did not receive a standing ovation. Bob's joke is repeated below. It is easier to appreciate in written form.

I have started making a few phone calls each day to keep in touch with those Club members. I suggest that you do the same as you are able. All it takes is a few minutes to possibly brighten someone's day as we all endure the "new normal" of "stay-in-place." If you find Club members who need assistance, please let me or **Michael Chavez** know so that we can set up "phone trees" to help those who may be unable to get out for grocery store trips or medical appointments.

I continue working with Vitalant, the company that Denver's Belle Bonfils Blood Center merged into, to see how we can conduct a blood drive in honor of **John Oss**, who continues to battle acute myeloid leukemia. The Vitalant representative I talked to indicated that their bloodmobile is booked for blood drives through the end of May but might be available to us in June. I will continue to explore this possibility and will keep everyone informed. We could coordinate our efforts with the Tamarac Optimist Club and the American Legion to get a significant turnout at a blood drive.
