Truman, showcased his ambidextrous talent when he threw out balls with both his right and left arm in 1950.

Optimist International Junior Golf CO-WY District Program Ron Cisco, Joe Marci, & Bob Meyer

Bob Meyer, CO-WY Junior Golf district chair and tri-chairman, **Joe Marci** and **Ron Cisco** were our speakers today, to give us an update and overview of the Optimist Junior Golf Program. Over 700 kids from 25 different countries will compete this year at the PGA national.

Our club sponsored 26 qualifying golfer's last year, and at least in part to our success, we now have spots for 41 qualifying kids this year.

There are several programs that raise funds to support the CO-WY golfers. Ron Cisco reported that at the two qualifying events (see flyer attached to GUMS distribution email), hole sponsorship's can be had for \$100 and two or more companies or individuals can split a sponsorship. Also, our club members shared in staffing a booth at the 2017 Denver Golf Expo in February. The Denver Golf Expo booth assists with promoting the program and in attracting donations. The District Optimist Junior Golf Program is totally self-funded.

Once again this year there are discounted Rockies tickets available, with a portion of each ticket going to Junior Golf (see attached flyer). The first Rockies game is Sunday, May 28st with the St. Louis Cardinals, and the second

Bob, Ron, and Joe would like to again give each of the qualifying junior golfer's the same amount of financial support as in the past, but this may not be possible due to the increased numbers. At the Optimist International Junior Golf Championships, which is held at the PGA National Resort & Spa, Palm Beach Gardens,

Florida, in July and August, golfer's are housed at a 4 star resort, their greens fees, and a meal package.
