In 1775 Britain's King George III proclaimed the American colonies to in a state of "open and avowed rebellion." And 24-years later in 1799 Napoleon leaves Egypt for France en route to seize power.

And on this date in 1970, organized by Mexican American union leader César Chávez, the Salad Bowl strike took place-the largest farm worker strike in U.S. history. While just 8-years ago, in 2011, a magnitude 5.8 earthquake occurred in Virginia, which damages monuments and structures in Washington D.C. resulting in damage estimated at \$200 to \$300 million.

Friday Baseball Quote

"When the ball was about four feet from my head I

knew it would get me. And I knew it would hurt because Hamilton was such a hard thrower. I was frightened ... I saw the ball follow me back and hit me square on the left side of my head. As soon as it crunched into me, it felt as if the



ball would go in one side of my head and come out the other; my legs gave way and I went down like a sack of potatoes. Just before everything went dark I saw the ball bounce straight down on home plate. It was the last thing I saw for several days." - Tony Conigliaro

Note: Tony Conigliaro was a Major League Baseball outfielder and right-handed batter who played for the Boston Red Sox and California Angels. He was born in Revere, Massachusetts, and was a 1962 graduate of St. Mary's High School in Lynn, Massachusetts.

He was signed by the Red Sox out of high school in 1963. By the next season he was patrolling the outfield in Fenway Park, still a teenager. That rookie season, he hit .290 with 24 HR and 52 RBI. The following season, at the age of 20, he led the league in home runs with 32.

In 1967, at the age of 24 already in his 4th season in the Bigs, he was hitting .287 with 20 HR and 67 RBI when he



was beaned by a Jack Hamilton fastball on August 18th (52 years ago Sunday). He did not play again that season, nor the next. He came back in the 1969 season, but was done by the age of 30 as his eyesight deteriorated in that eye. He died of a heart attack at the age of 45, in 1990.
