Some Little Known Driving Laws & Rules

Here are just some of Colorado's little-known laws and rules of the road that drivers should be aware of:

- Under 18: No cell phones are allowed. While texting and driving are against the law for every motorist, drivers under 18 years of age are additionally prohibited from using a cell phone to make calls while driving.
- Take the headphones off. It is illegal in Colorado to wear headphones while driving.
- Do not merge if you are going to slow traffic. Merging traffic must yield the right-of-way to all oncoming vehicles.
 Additionally, drivers must avoid merging if it means another vehicle must slow down for you.
- Parked car crash: Leave note or call police? In Colorado, you must do both. If you crash into a parked car and cannot find the owner, call police and then leave a note.
- The Right Way to Use Your Turn Signals
 - ♦ Making a left or right-hand turn at an intersection
 - ♦ Entering a driveway or parking lot on either side of the road
 - ♦ Parking on the side of the street
 - ♦ Pulling over to the side of the road
 - ♦ Changing lanes
 - ♦ Passing another vehicle on the road
 - ♦ Merging with traffic when entering a roadway
 - ♦ When leaving a roundabout or taking a highway exit

In Colorado even if there is no other vehicles or pedestrians in the area, you are required to use your turn signals. There may be traffic you cannot see, and using them should be a habit in every situation.

Alberto Rodriguez District Director of the Denver Boy Scouts of America

Frank Middleton introduced today's guest speaker, Al-





berto Rodriguez. Alberto is the Frontier District Director of the Denver Boy Scouts of America. The Frontier District serves the Denver County and Denver Public Schools. Alberto is originally from Venezuela and arrived in the U.S. to attend the University of Florida. He started working for the Boy Scout in 2007 while living in Florida. In 2016 he was promoted and moved to Denver.

Alberto began by saying thank you for the work our club does with Scout groups. The Boy Scouts are a not for profit organization and are funded by the communities where they work and provide programs. www.denverboyscouts.org/ The Denver Area Council is located at 10455 W 6th Avenue, Suite 100.

Alberto says that local scouting is strong. They have developed scouting at home programs such as geo-caching, hiking, mainly focused on getting kids outside safely as much as possible. He wanted to invite any and all club members to attend the Denver Area Council's Sports Breakfast coming up on Wednesday, August 26th. This will be the 44th annual event, and all details, including how to register, can be found at https://secure.qgiv.com/event/sportsbreakfast/

The event is normally in person at the Pepsi Center, however this year it will be virtual with soon to be NFL Hall of Famer Steve Atwater as the MC. The event is open to everyone and there is no cost at participating. This is their largest fundraiser, and they have a goal to raise \$600,000 and they are well on the way with \$366,000 so far! Follow the link to register, and you can join Alberto's team.

The current crisis has disrupted the Scouts camping programs, of course, but Alberto took questions and shared information on a couple of their sites. The Charles S. McNeil Peaceful Valley Scout Ranch (PV) is the larger of the DAC's two camp properties. PV is located on the edge of the Black Forest, 65 miles southeast of Denver, near the town of Elbert. The property includes 3,316 acres of mountain park terrain and sits at 7,000 feet in elevation along the Palmer Divide. In addition to summer opportunities, there are numerous opportunities for weekend camping during the offseason, including unit use of the shooting ranges, rock climbing, and the ATV safety program. Alberto says the dining hall was recently expanded, and the camp is open year-round and offers tours to visitors.

Closer to home, the Donald E. Scott Adventure Point is just off 6th Avenue between Kipling and Union. It is a 20,000 -square-foot Scouting and community adventure education facility designed to promote essential skills and a love of adventure. It includes a two-story rock-climbing wall, archery, and air rifle ranges, the Enger Family Technology lab, banquet rooms, the Steven G. Shrader Culinary Lab, the Graebel Relocation Services Outdoor Adventure Zone, Mark E. Honnen Leadership Development Center, and the Walter F. Imhoff Sustainability Lab. Alberto shared an update on the national BSA bankruptcy. It is proceeding, but the Denver area group is solvent and self-sufficient financially. He shared a link with updates on the restructuring. The BSA has a July 2021 goal of coming out of Chapter 11, see https://www.bsarestructuring.org/
