Allen Perry & Ron Cisco Supporting the Optimist Foundation via the Dime-A-Day Program

Our speaker this morning is our own **Perry Allen** and **Ron Cisco**. Perry is the Club's Dime-A-Day representative, and Ron is again serving as the CO-WY OI Foundation Representative.

OPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL

Dime-A-Day

Ron explains that the OI Foundation is set up to provide funding for Optimist International's youth and service programs and is proudly supported by individual Optimists, their clubs, and the community at large. This year he has taken on the challenge of being the Optimist International representative, and today he is here to talk about the Foundation.

The Optimist International Foundation (OIF) was established in 1971 exclusively

for the charitable, literary, and educational purposes of Optimist International, a community service-based organization committed to creating a more optimistic future for young people through innovative programs. OIF works with Optimist Clubs located in over 2,100 communities in the United States and the Caribbean.

The Foundation has grown steadily since 1971 and is recognized as a not-for-profit 501(c)(3) charitable organization. The Foundation's Board of Directors grants funds to Optimist International each year for the development and improvement of International programs. Programs funded by the Foundation serve 1.5 million children annually. Optimist International Foundation depends on the support from Optimist Clubs and individual Members, the general public, businesses and corporations.

As part of the OIF's outreach they sponsor a Dime-A-Day program. **Perry Allen** has been the coordinator for this program, and has done an excellent job. Perry shares that again this week he has received 8 to 10 checks of a minimum of \$36.50 to support this year round program.

Ron shares that within the CO-WY district 189 people Have donated to this cause. Ron's goal this year is to break the 62 members of MSOC who have donated previously.

Perry Allen takes the microphone, and talks about some of the "10 Things Accomplished in 2016" by the Foundation, such as:

OPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL

Dime-A-Day

 Paid out \$246,164 to Clubs utilizing the Club Campaign program and added an additional \$10,175 in interest to Club Campaign funds.

 Supported the launch of the Optimist International Oratorical World Championship Contest through commitment of startup funding.

 Helped 269 Optimists help 5,285 children and their families by awarding 20 Club Grants across the U.S.

- Contributed \$40,908 towards the Optimist International Research Fellowship in Pediatric Hematology and Oncology at Johns Hopkins.
- Assisted Clubs in donating \$68,244 in charitable contributions to their own local Childhood Cancer organizations and hospitals.

Additionally, Perry mentions he has left information cards on the tables on how the foundation serves OI.

Perry says that Tom Overton recently attended a meeting at the Tamarac Optimist Club and that they have a practice that anyone who donates to Dime-A-Day has their name placed in a hat for an annual drawing for prizes. Possibly this is something we should try.

Perry thanks everyone who has donated so far, and encourages others to donate. The program goes on for the entire year, so you can bring in a check at any time.
