President **Bob Meyer** rings the morning bell and asks us to greet one another and to share an *Optimist Welcome*!




#### Invocation & Pledge



able five-gallon outdoor sink! That will be awesome for the Tree Lot, for years to come should it find itself there. Tracy Sorenson gets a digital picture frame.





Frank Middleton receives a set o ceramic figurines that




set of sunglasses, lanyard, and an orange towel to waive.
