From the Prez

Since it is Friday, February 2nd and it is Groundhog Day, President **Jim Easton** forgot to ask if there were any guests on this Friday mornings after his welcome. Instead we learned:

Groundhog Day is a popular tradition celebrated in the United States and Canada on February 2. It derives from the Pennsylvania Dutch superstition that if a groundhog emerging from its burrow on this day sees a shadow due to clear weather, it will retreat to its den and winter will persist for six more weeks, and if he does not, due to cloudiness, spring season will arrive early.

The groundhog (Marmota monax), also known as a woodchuck, is a rodent of the family Sciuridae, belonging to the group of large ground squirrels known as marmots. It was first scientifically described by Carl Linnaeus in 1758. [The groundhog is also referred to as a chuck, wood-shock, groundpig, whistlepig, whistler, thickwood badger, Canada marmot, monax, moonack, weenusk and red monk. The name "thickwood badger" was given in the Northwest to distinguish the animal from the prairie badger. Monax was a Native American name of the woodchuck, which meant "the

digger". Young groundhogs may be called chucklings. Other marmots, such as the yellow-bellied and hoary marmots, live in rocky and mountainous areas, but the groundhog is a low-land creature. It is widely distributed in North America and common in the northeastern and central United States and Canada. Groundhogs are found as far north as Alaska, with their habitat extending southeast to Georgia.




until at least May. So, do not forget the Dime-A-Day Program while he is not here to remind

National History Day in Colorado Kayla Gabehart

Karl Geil introduced today's speaker, the Associate Director of National History Day in Colorado. Kayla Gabehart. Kayla is a Colorado native who has been with Colorado History Day for seven years. The program is a social studies and literacy program for middle school and high school students. The kids choose a topic related to the annual theme and then present to judges. For this academic year the theme is "Conflict & Compromise in History." Many Monaco South members have been involved as volunteer judges over the years. The five formats are:

- ♦ Exhibits: student present a tri-fold sign board
- Website: kids who like technology develop a website
- Documentaries: a chance to show off video skills
- Performance: dramatic presentations with accurate costuming
- Paper: not as popular, but of excellent quality All the categories, except papers, can be done as individuals or in groups. This gives kids a chance to show off their history knowledge in the format that most suits them. Kayla shared a video of a powerful performance from an award-winning student, who

performed as Maximilien Robespierre, a French lawyer and politician.

The state contest will be held on May 5th at the University of Colorado Denver, and Kayla distributed a flyer for interested judges to signup. The other dates and locations are:

- March 10th at Bear Creek High School in Lakewood
- March 17th at the Anschutz Medical Center in Aurora
 • April 7th at History Colorado/
- Denver Art Museum

For winners this ultimately leads to the National Contest held at the University of Maryland, College Park. MD.
