Hannah Hoogenboom & Gina Hallisey Juvenile Diabetes Research Fund & Automezzi Exotic Italian Car-Motorcycle Show

Ron Gustas introduced our speakers today, Ms. Hannah Hoogenboom and Gina Hallisey. As we know, Ron has been promoting this special event since it is fundraiser for the JDFR organization. One Hundred Percent of the ticket sale proceeds from attendees of the "Automezzi Colorado 2019 Celebration" goes to the JDRF Diabetes Foundation.

While Gina was setting up her slide presentation, we had a little update on Juvenile Diabetes Research



Fund from <u>Hannah Hoogen-</u> <u>boom</u>, JDFR Development Director. Hannah said that JDRF is doing research for a number of auto-immune diseases, but specifically oriented toward Type 1, which is prevalent in children. There is some concern about the affordability of insulin, espe-

cially in the lower socio-economic areas.

Type 1 diabetes is an autoimmune disease that strikes both children and adults suddenly. It has nothing to do with diet or lifestyle. There is nothing you can do to prevent it. And, at present, there is no cure.

In T1D, your pancreas stops producing insulin—a hormone the body needs to get energy from food. This means a process your body does naturally and automatically becomes something that now requires your daily attention and manual intervention. If you have T1D, you must constantly monitor your blood-sugar level, inject or infuse insulin through a pump, and carefully balance these insulin doses with your eating and activity throughout the day and night.

However, insulin is not a cure for diabetes. Even with the most vigilant disease management, a significant portion of your day will be spent with either high or low blood-sugar levels. These fluctuations place people with T1D at risk for potentially life-threatening hypoglycemic and hyperglycemic episodes as well as devastating long-term complications such as kidney failure, heart attack, stroke, blindness, and amputation.

She explained that with Type 2 the pancreas still works and effects of disease can be controlled through diet, exercise and other methods whereas, with Type

She commented that pancreas transplants are not common, because of organ rejection. She mentioned that there are over 100 different autoimmune diseases and that they often "travel together," meaning that many people have more than one.

Our other speaker, <u>Gina Hallisey</u>, is the Automezzi event coordinator with 30+ years of expertise in the end-to-end development and execution of innovative events. Gina has owned and operated her own event company, <u>Get Connected Events</u> successfully since 2000, assisting both private business and public entities with venue/event design, event operation/logistics,



sales management and staff training. She also serves as the Director of the Automezzi Exotic Italian Car and Motorcycle Show.
