Super Citizen Principals to Breakfast: Robert Wardlaw, coordinator for the Super Citizen Program







She coordinates volunteer activities for Project Access which is based in Southern California and has 64 centers across the USA.

Project Access Mission Statement states, "To be the leading provider of vital on-site health, education and employment services to low-income families, children and seniors. Our goal is to give low income families the tools needed to break the cycle of poverty, be-
