# Mike McPhee, author "Dana Crawford: 50 Years Saving the Soul of a City"

**Paul Simon** introduces our guest speaker Mike McPhee, a retired award winning reporter for the Associated Press and Denver Post, who authored the book, "Dana Crawford: 50 Years Saving the Soul of a City." Mike was here to tell the story and epic saga of Denver's most illustrious and visionary woman, Dana Crawford — the most quoted woman in Colorado history

Mike shared that he was born in Aspen and is an East High School graduate. He said, when he moved to Denver to report for the Rocky Mountain News, his editors

occasionally dispatched him to an abandoned flour mill, in lower downtown where hobos had started yet another fire. He also had occasional assignments in the LoDo neighborhood area, which stimulated his redeveloped interests. Pushing that redevelopment was Dana Crawford.

It all began somewhere between lower downtown Denver, Larimer Square and the new Union Station over 40 years ago. Dana Crawford is now 87 years young and currently working on the redevelopment of downtown Trinidad, Colorado. And the old Argo Mine hotel and restaurant conversion in Idaho Springs.

Mike said he self-published this book as he saw it a great importance for memorializing the outstanding and determined life of Dana.

Dana was born in Salina Kansas, an only child. Her Father owned the first Ford dealership in Kansas and went on to build a marina with the first Chris-Craft dealership. At Salina High School she was number one in her class.

Dana received a BA degree, not a Mrs., at Radcliffe University affectionally known as the women's Harvard. She bragged this is where she learned how to drink martinis. In 1953, she relocated to Denver and became infatuated with the 14<sup>th</sup> and Larimer site of the original Denver town hall.

Over time DURA (Denver Urban Renewal Authority) began acquiring property from Curtis Street to Union Station. Corruption infested, and the old Post Office and Tabor building suffered the march to more and more parking lots. The only surviving buildings of this "progressive" onslaught were the Old Spaghetti Factory and the Daniels Tower.

At one time Arapahoe County was a major piece of real estate with the county line running all the way to the Wyo-

ming and Kansas state lines. Finally the City and County of Denver evolved and in 1920 the original City and County Denver Building was purchased by developer and promoter "the Donald" Zeckendorf and culminated in the May Daniels & Fisher plaza ice rink in the early 1950's. Ieoh Ming Pei, commonly known as I. M. Pei, a Chinese American architect designed a 700 room Hilton Hotel that was the end result. Interestingly, he shared, that Mayor Quigg Newton wanted the "gold" found while they dug the foundation at this site.

Dana decide that Denver needed a gathering place similar to her memories of New England and set about rebuilding Old Larimer Street. The rest is a legendary history of a woman determined to save Denver from the wrecking ball and Larimer Square was her child.


With no money, property or experience she convinced 15 investors of her vision and they bought up the entire block through separate purchases. Currigan Wright Wooten was one of her first true believers. He commented later that the only profit he made was a case of wine. She married John Crawford, a geologist, and gave birth to four boys in 5-years.

After they moved to Larimer street John died in 1985 on the sidewalk of a heart attack. She then moved to 629 Humboldt Street and then to 17<sup>th</sup> and Emerson. She now resides in a condo she developed at the old Hungarian Flour Building, in lower downtown.

Along the way Mayors Federico Pena and Wellington Webb helped take down the elevated viaducts to make way for future development. The final crown jewel is the Union Station historical redevelopment. Channel 6 produced a tremendous account of that project—much of which came

from Mike McPhee's research—including a bit on the Vietnamese chandeliers, which is now part of "Denver's living Room." The 2014 opening date was exactly 100 years to the day the first Union Station was christened. You can read all about it in his fantastic book.

Thank you Mike, we all hope to see again real soon!
