If you have a camera and microphone on your computer, you are all set. Just click on the link in the email invitation Fridays at 10:00 a.m. and you will be connected to the meeting. If you do not have a camera and microphone on your computer, you can connect to the meeting on your smartphone.

I have allowed two hours for the meeting. I do not expect

the "business" meeting to take that long, but I wanted to add sufficient time for everyone to socialize in the absence of a physical meeting.

The Board of Directors met via Zoom last Wednesday night. It was good to see so many smiling faces. The Board approved \$ 1,000 donations to the Denver Public Schools Foundation Food Security Fund and the Denver YMCA's programs to provide food distribution and to provide emergency childcare for the families of first responders and medical personnel.

We were able to fund these donations because several of the youth activities and projects in our 2019-2020 budget were cancelled because of "stay-at-home" orders.

The Board of Directors will continue as good stewards of the Club's finances. No one can accurately predict when we will return to the "old normal." Many, many, families will endure significant financial hardships in the coming months. The 2020 Christmas tree sales will more than likely not approach the levels of recent years, so we must keep a watchful eye on our income and expenditures to ensure that the Club can fund youth activities and projects once the COVID-19 crisis has moderated.

I have reached out to <u>Vitalant</u>, the company that Denver's Belle Bonfils Blood Center merged into, to see how we can conduct a blood drive in honor of **John Oss**, who continues to undergo blood infusions and transfusions in his battle against acute myeloid leukemia. John was re-admitted to Swedish Hospital earlier this week after he developed a fever.

I have started making a few phone calls each day to keep in touch with Club members. I suggest that you do the same as you are able. All it takes is a few minutes to possibly brighten someone's day as we all endure the "new normal" of "stayat-home." If you find Club members who need assistance, please let me or **Michael Chavez** know so that we can set up "phone trees" to help those who may be unable to get out for grocery store trips or medical appointments.



Hi Pat Bush and Monaco South members, I enjoyed your stories in the last *GUMS*. They made me

reflect on some MSOC events of the past. A brief recollection is below.

When the club was being formed, I recall the several times **AI Brunner** and **Marlin Kent** would see me working outside in the yard and come over to twist my arm to come to a meeting as the club was just beginning to be formed. We needed 35 potential members to officially form the club and being official was

important. I finally caved in as Marlin had my left arm and Al my right. We would meet at the Bonanza Steak House next to the old K Mart. Eggs were a tad overdone but the comradery was great. Next thing I knew we, the MSOC Board, were in the basement of the Moore Realty building on E. Hampden to charter the club. **Craig Eley** once owned this building—small world.

Bob Rhue, our first President, asked me to help **Marlin Kent** and **Jerry Whitlow** make the first-year club scrapbook. This brought back memories of the scrapbooks my Grand-mother made for me back in ancient times before I was five. So, I agreed. As everyone knows engineers are not known for our spelling skills. After several attempts at doing what they asked, I was delegated to do the artwork and drawings. This was much better and needless to say there were several drawings of trains and train-related items. Not sure this is what Bob had in mind but that was the way it was. I have not been asked again to help with a scrapbook.

One event that sticks in my mind was the Alzheimer's Walk where we assisted them in setting up tents, tables and helped others to get the vendors' goods from the parking lot to their tent location. **Freddie Pasternak** looked a little distracted, so I told Freddie to come with me to help people unload their cars and get their goodies to their tents. Freddie said OK but I could tell he really wanted to drive the golf cart that we used. I told Freddie to take the wheel. I did not know golf carts could go so fast. Freddie would point to something to the right, then the left never paying much attention to stay on the asphalt walkway. I remember a 3-feet tall bush that Freddie took out with the golf cart. He must have really enjoyed watching the squirrels as I never could tell what he was always pointing toward.


Then there were the times when the club helped the Channel 6 auction for several years. We would set up the items to be auctioned on tables. Oscar Sorensen and I grabbed a grocery cart full of stuff to set up. The lady with the clip board and microphone headset pointed us to the correct table. We were supposed to set the items in a particular order left to right according to the list we were given. This way the auctioneer and camera operator were in sync so that when a ceramic rabbit was being described the camera would not be focused on a wooden rocking horse. We were significantly challenged when we had to place a picture of modern art on the table. Oscar looked at me and I him, which is the top of the picture? After turning the darn thing every way, we could, Oscar finally said this is the top and so we set it that way. A couple of minutes later the lady with the clip board came over and turned the picture so that the top was now at the bottom and gave us a not so friendly grin. I told Oscar I needed some scotch to put in my glass of water and he agreed that was a good idea. About 5 minutes later another lady came to the table just as we were setting up the last item. She looked at the modern art picture and turned it the way we originally had it. She looked at us with a quizzical grin. I gave her a thumbs up. The scotch could wait a few minutes now.

I will leave you with this one. We were delivering Christmas food baskets one year. We had 5 total to distribute. The first 4 families were certainly thankful. I survived a big hug from a lady recipient who must have been at least 300 pounds. I remember not breathing for a few seconds. Finally, we were on number 5 and found the apartment. Anyway, we kept banging on number five's door and finally a young boy about 5 years old opened the door. We told him who we were which meant nothing to him and that we brought food. His eyes got big and he let us in. We asked where his Mom or Dad were and he pointed down a hallway. So, I naturally looked that direction. There was Mom with someone in bed celebrating a birthday, I guess. They were too busy to see me. Never did meet them either. We just got the heck out of there.

Is not this club the best ever and does it not provide the most entertaining opportunities!
