At Friday's meeting, Joe Marci announced that he has now received 13 applications from TJ High School students for the Sullivan Scholarships and asked for volunteers to review the applications in May. The budget for the Sullivan Scholarships is set at \$6,000 for six scholarships, so the volunteer committee will have its work cut out.
