


Casino Night Fundraiser: Phil Perington announced

Many remember Les as the OI Convention District Ambassador from 2007-2015.

In addition, he was president of the DTC OC in 2011-12, and had served as their Foundation Rep from 2009-2014.

Les Sitter was the epitome of Optimism and will be missed. He was a fantastic Colorado/Wyoming Governor and I fondly remember his successful year at the helm with his Optimist wife Clara by his side. Les was a true Southern gentleman and devoted family man. On behalf of the Colorado/Wyoming Optimist District, I tip my hat to a lovely man and a life well lived.

He is survived by his wife, Clara; daughter, Susan Elizabeth Sitter; son Scott Douglas Sitter (Michelle) and 6 grandchildren.




# Lowry Elementary Community Volunteer Day On Saturday May 18<sup>th</sup> Lowry Elementary held their spring
