Dr. Sawyer shared that Ms. Amy Kalinchuk is always humbled by her students and does everything she can for

kids by helping them discover the power of their own minds and the magic of the skills in reading. As a special education teacher, Amy strives to "serve students" and believes this is her true mission. As she states, *"It is what I am supposed to do. They are amazing and I couldn't do what I do without the spirit of optimism and the support you give. I believe in*

optimism and share it with my students." For her students, diagnosed with dyslexia are the most difficult. She says, "The key is hearing the words, which then helps them to associate those words while learning to read. In all cases, if you start them early they can teach themselves with my help."
